### **Govt crushes AI strike; 17 union men sacked, several suspended**

The government on Wednesday crushed the two-day-old strike by Air India unions that was launched 72 hours after the horrific crash at Mangalore and affected about 30,000 passengers, and there are indications that normal operations will be restored in two or three days.

The union leaders, who were protesting against a gag order, withdrew the strike in the face of a tough management and a Delhi high court order that termed the action illegal and directed the 14,000-odd workers to resume duties immediately.

The AI management, meanwhile, has launched a massive crackdown on the powerful unions. It had by 9pm either dismissed or suspended about 50 union leaders and sources said more action could follow through the night.

Air India officials said nearly 140 flights, mostly in the domestic sector, could not be operated because of the strike since Tuesday.

The strike, they said, dealt a blow to the cash-strapped carrier, causing it a loss of nearly Rs. 12 crore and also affected the travel plans of thousands of passengers who remained stranded in major cities.

#### **AI strike: Western Railway to run special Rajdhani train**

Western Railway said that it will run a special Mumbai-Delhi Rajdhani train from on Wednesday for airport passengers left stranded due to the ongoing Air India employees' strike.

The train will leave from Mumbai Central at 2250 hours and reach Delhi at 1800 hours, the next day.

The coaches will give passengers comfort on par with the airline travel. It will have 1A, 2A and 3A accommodation.

### **Unsafe capital: 212 rape cases in first five months**

When it comes to crime against women, Delhi Police's own records make the picture quite clear: the capital remains unsafe for women. This year so far, 212 cases of rape have been registered in Delhi i.e on an average every 24 hours, at least one case of rape is registered.

Even more alarming is the fact that despite the police claims of tough enforcement and action against the accused, the number of crimes against women has increased this year. Last year, 210 rape cases were reported till May 25. Molestation cases too have seen a rise — 135 cases have been reported so far compared to 130 cases reported in the same period last year.

#### **Duo loaded cash in Oshiwara ATM only to steal it later**

Five people have been arrested for allegedly stealing Rs10 lakh from an HDFC ATM machine at Oshiwara.

The two of them work for the company entrusted with the responsibility of depositing cash in ATMs.

The two, employees of Secure Trans India Private Limited, have been identified as Munna Yadav, 22, and Ram Ashish Yadav, 21.

The others are: Ramesh Kumar Yadav alias Guddu, 27; Ramjanam Yadav, 31; and Dharmendra Yadav, 31. The police said Ramesh is Munna's elder brother.

According to a police officer, the duo was also in possession of the secret six-digit code that is used while depositing cash in an ATM. The two had revealed the code to their accomplices.

#### **Cyber crime: victims don't know whom to call**

What do you do in case you come across a cyber crime?

Well, 79% of the educated Mumbai residents do not have an answer, as was found out during a survey conducted by a team of experts from the KPMG Advisory Services.

The survey was conducted by speaking to Mumbaikars and contacting them through email.

The results of the survey were released at a round table conference held on Tuesday at the Indian Merchants' Chamber. The conference was part of the Cyber Safety Week organised by Mumbai police.

In case of cyber crime people can contact police stations or the cyber crime cell. Also, complaints can be posted on the website [www.copconnect.com](http://www.copconnect.com). Other than cheating, frauds and data thefts, cyber terrorism too is a problem. The cyber machinery has been used in the past by terror groups and they could use it to plan their operations and get information about people.

### **Avoid these roads, say police**

Following the closure of a part of Hosur Road for the construction of an underpass by the Bruhat Bangalore Mahangara Palike near Kendriya Sadana, the Bangalore city police have requested motorists to avoid certain roads in the vicinity of the proposed underpass to avoid gridlocks.

The road has been closed between Madivala police station junction and St. John's Hospital junction.

Traffic has been diverted via Sarjapura Road, Krupanidhi College and Santhe Beedhi.

Gridlocks are expected on these roads as they are much narrower than the roads closed. Hence commuters should avoid roads passing through Forum Mall, Madivala, Checkpost, Koramangala Water Tank, Krupanidhi College, Madivala police station and Silk Board.

Motorists coming from BTM Layout may use Bannerghatta Road through Jayadeva Hospital to move further. They can commute to-and-from City Centre instead of coming towards Silk Board. Similarly, vehicles coming from HSR Layout can pass through 14th Cross, HSR Layout (BDA Complex) Road next to Agara Lake, Jakkasandra, Aishwarya Departmental Store, Wipro junction, Maharaja Hotel junction and Sony World junction in Koramangala to move further, and avoid Silk Board.

#### **Major fire tragedy averted: Cable meant for BSNL damaged in factory close to Power Grid**

Cable worth several lakhs of rupees was damaged in a devastating fire that broke out at Singla Cables in the industrial area here yesterday afternoon. A major tragedy could have happened, as the cable factory was adjacent to the Power Grid station and a menthol factory. Luckily, no one was injured and the fire was brought under control after nearly four hours.

Around 3:30 pm, a bundle of cable came in touch with a welding set in the yard of Singla Cables and caught fire. Though the employees tried to douse the fire, it spread and engulfed the whole factory.

Nearly 100 employees of the factory were trapped when they tried to save the shed of the factory and the fire melted the steel roof partially.

This misappropriation led to a loss of almost Rs 2.36 lakh for the company.

#### **Normality returns to a politically uncertain Darjeeling**

**Oil slick in Singapore Strait, coastline not affected**

An oil slick from a tanker involved in a collision with a bulk carrier in the Singapore Strait has not affected the city-state's coastline, the Marine and Port Authority (MPA) said on Wednesday.

Crude from the tanker MT Bunga Kelana 3 is being transferred out of the vessel after the collision a day ago, spilling some 2,500 tonnes of light crude oil.

MPA had said that traffic along the strait, Asia's busiest shipping lane, remained unaffected. The incident caused significant damage to the vessel's hull and resulted in a spill of Bintulu light crude oil that is now being cleaned up by specialists.
