### **Karol Bagh jeweller robbed of Rs 5L, shot by two bikers**

Two bike-borne assailants allegedly shot a 36-year-old jeweller and made away with his car and a bag containing Rs 5 lakh cash, in Ranola area of southwest district on Sunday.

Police said the incident took place around 5.30pm in Baprola village. The victim, Roshan Lal, was going towards Najafgarh with his colleague Dhananjay, when two bikers fired at their car on an isolated stretch on the Najafgarh-Nangloi road. Lal was hit by a bullet and as soon as the car came to a halt, the assailants dragged Lal and his colleague out.

### **Retd banker robbed of cash, jewellery**

Four armed robbers yesterday broke open the house of a retired bank employee in east Delhi early in the morning and decamped with jewellery and cash.

The robbers were armed and had covered their faces with monkey caps. They broke open the grill of the house of S K Sharma in the Preet Vihar area around 5 am.

The robbers woke up Sharma, his wife and family members, and tied them with a rope before decamping with Rs 2100, a gold chain and a bangle.

Moreover, the robbers also asked Sharma and his family members to keep quiet and not to raise the alarm. Police said the family members claimed that the armed robbers seemed to be Bangladeshis.

### **Kidnapped girl rescued after chase in Choolaimedu**

There was high drama at Choolaimedu on Sunday morning when a 24-year-old woman was kidnapped by three men in a car and local residents and passers-by gave chase. The incident ended when the kidnappers turned into a narrow street and had to stop. It was a cul-de-sac. Soon, the police turned up and the girl, an assistant engineer in a private bank, was rescued.

Preliminary inquiries revealed that the one of the three kidnappers, a doctor who is related to the girl, planned to abduct her after coming to know that she was to be engaged to a city-based doctor in January.

### **Police hunt for 20 agents of credit card racket kingpin**

Police now have information about key associate and 20 sub-agents who were working for Vijaykanth, a Sri Lankan Tamil running a credit card racket for over seven months in the city.

Vijaykanth's interrogation after he was caught on Thursday revealed that he had collected more than Rs 50 lakh using fake credit cards.

Vijaykanth had managed to get details pertaining to foreign credit cards after paying his contacts in Canada and other countries. He produced many fake credit cards using an encoding machine. Valuables worth over Rs 50 lakh were purchased using the cards, police said.

### **JAC calls for Telangana bandh on December 30**

The all-party Telangana Joint Action Committee (JAC), at a meeting on Sunday night, gave a call for a bandh in the region on December 30 in support of its demand for statehood.

The decision for a one-day bandh meant ignoring a suggestion by Telangana Rashtra Samiti (TRS) president K. Chandrasekhar Rao to disrupt normal life with an indefinite bandh from December 29. Mr. Rao had suggested to the JAC on Friday that a December 28 evening ultimatum be served on Prime Minister Manmohan Singh to announce commencement of the constitutional process to form Telangana or face an indefinite bandh from the next day.

### **BJP to launch 'Jai Andhra' stir from today**

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) will launch 'Jai Andhra' movement with "like-minded" leaders from Vijayawada on Monday, BJP president of Andhra Pradesh Bandaru Dattatreya announced here on Sunday.

At a press conference, he said the party would also undertake a campaign on the issue in Kukatpally area here where a large number people from the Andhra and Rayalaseema regions reside. He said the BJP had been consistent on bifurcation of the State.

### Traffic diversions today

The city police have imposed traffic restrictions in connection with Bibi-ka-Alam procession in old city from 11 a.m. to 9 p.m. on Monday.

Vehicular traffic coming from Dabeerpura towards Alawa Bibi will be diverted at Sunargalli 'T' junction towards Mata-ki-Khidki. Traffic coming from Dabeerpura will not be allowed towards Shaik Faiz Kaman and will be diverted at Jabber Hotel.

Vehicles coming from Yakutpura railway station towards Shaik Faiz Kaman will be diverted at Bada Bazaar 'T' junction towards Mir Jumla Talab Katta via Chowni. Motorists coming from Purani Haveli towards Ethebar Chowk will be diverted at Setwin crossroads towards Dabeerpura.

Traffic coming from Mitti-Ka-Sher towards Ethebar Chowk will be diverted at Gulzar Houz towards Madina crossroads when procession reaches Ethebar Chowk.

Vehicles coming from Moghalpura towards Kotla Alija will be diverted at Bibi Bazaar crossroads towards Talabkatta, those coming from water tank Moghalpura towards Chowk Maidan Khan will be diverted at Hafez Danka mosque towards Shah Ali Banda. Vehicles from Shah Ali Banda towards Charminar will be diverted at Paris Café towards Moghalpura. Traffic coming from Puranapool towards Charminar will be diverted at Chowk Murgon towards Chelapura, Shahgunj, and Khilwath. Those coming from Himmathpura towards Khilwath, and Lad Bazaar will be diverted at Motigalli towards Moosa Bowli. Those coming from Shakkerkote will be diverted at Mitti-ka-Sher towards Ghansi Bazaar and Chelapura.

Traffic coming from City College and Muslim Jung Bridge will be diverted at New Bridge towards Afzalgunj when the procession reaches Alawa Sartouq. Motorists coming from Nayapool towards Charminar will be diverted at Madina crossroads towards City College when the procession reaches Kotla Alija. Vehicles coming from Chaderghat, Salarjung Bridge and Noor Khan Bazaar will not be allowed towards Purani Haveli, and will be diverted towards Nayapool at Dar-ul-Shifa crossroads. Motorists coming from Chaderghat will not be allowed towards Kali Kabar and will be diverted to Shanti Lodge towards Chaderghat Bridge when the procession reaches Alawa Sartouq. Vehicles coming from Gowliguda will not be allowed towards Aza Khana Zohra via Salar Jung Bridge and will be diverted towards Afzalgunj from Gowliguda side of Salarjung Bridge.

APSRTC district buses will be diverted to Gowliguda and Rang Mahal Road for entry and exit from 2 p.m. to 9 p.m. on Monday. Buses should not come on Kalikabar road till the completion of procession.

Restrictions will also be imposed on traffic movement in Secunderabad from 4 p.m. to 8.30 p.m. Vehicles proceeding from Hyderabad via Tankbund towards Karbala Maidan will be diverted at Children's Park towards Kavadiguda, Bible House and R.P. Road.

Vehicles from the R.P.Road towards Karbala Maidan will be diverted at the traffic Island near Begumpet traffic police station, Bible House via Tankbund Road and will join Tankbund Road at DBR Mills 'T' junction. M.G. Road between the Central Telegraph Island and Ranigunj will be 'one-way' towards Ranigunj side.

### Ulfa linkman held with explosives

Barely a few hours after a camp court sent Ulfa chairman Arabinda Rajkhowa to judicial custody, police have arrested a linkman of the outfit and found one kg of explosives on him in the city.

Dharmendra Kalita was arrested while he was moving around the railway tracks near the Guwahati Refinery at Noonmati on Saturday night. One kg of explosives was found in his possession. We still don't know whether it's RDX or not.

Besides the explosives, police found ball-bearings of cycles and some metal screws on Dharmendra. Saloi said Guwahati has always been a prime target of the militants and police are always on a maximum alert to thwart any rebel bid to carry out sabotage activities here.

There is a general alert that militants may try to trigger blasts in the city, expressing concern over Ulfa's strategy to engage people, who do not belong to the outfit, in carrying explosives and planting bombs.

### Bomb blast in Imphal, 4 wounded

Four persons were injured as a bomb went off near a hospital in Imphal West district this afternoon.

Official sources said the bomb, kept by unidentified militants near Sky hospital, exploded injuring four persons.

The injured persons were taken to the Regional Institute of Medical Sciences hospital for treatment

### Terror scare on Detroit-bound flight once again

The same Detroit-bound Northwest Airlines flight, which was targeted on Christmas day, has encountered trouble once again with the crew asking for emergency assistance for a disruptive passenger who was later arrested, but FBI termed it as a "non-serious incident".

The passenger, also a Nigerian national whose name has not been revealed by US authorities, was released after US Customs and Border Police and Federal Bureau of Investigation found him "not a security risk".

Already on the alert following a failed attempt to blow up the Detroit-bound plane on Friday, the flight crew became concerned on Sunday after the man became sick and spent about an hour locked in the bathroom.

### **10 killed, 100 injured in two simultaneous blasts in Pakistan**

Two near-simultaneous terror strikes on Sunday targeted Shia religious gatherings in the southern port city of Karachi and the capital of Pakistan-occupied Kashmir, killing at least 10 people and injuring nearly 100.

A suicide bomber detonated his explosives when police guards prevented him from entering the Pir Alam Shah Bukhari 'imambargah' or Shia prayer hall in PoK capital Muzaffarabad.

Provincial minister Ghulam Murtaza Gillani said 10 people were killed in the attack and eighty people, including some policemen, were injured.

The 'imambargah' is located in a high-security area near a military hospital, where the injured were taken.
