Delhi: 3 hurt as drunk man opens fire

Three people were injured in Delhi on Sunday after a drunk man opened fire at them after a scuffle when they prevented him from entering the building where his sister-in-law lived, police said.

"A drunk man identified as a employee of Delhi Jal Board, reportedly opened fire on three people, who prevented him from entering a building on G B Road and allegedly beat him up," a senior police official said. The three worked as guards and helpers at the building.

"Prasad then pulled out his licensed revolver and opened fire at them, injuring all the three," the official said.

3 bizmen held for defrauding SBI

Three businessmen who floated bogus companies, forged a letter of credit (LC) of Punjab National Bank and defrauded the State Bank of India, Fort branch, of Rs 8.9 crore were arrested by the CBI on Thursday.

The arrested have been identified as Satish Krishna Pujari (42) who posed as the director of Micro Bit Associate Private Limited, Akhilesh Pandey, proprietor Meroo Polymers and Anoop Roy of Krishna Corporate Services Pvt Ltd. They have been remanded in police custody.

The CBI is now looking for some other accused, including bank officials, who may have helped the trio. The scam was brought to light by Ganesh Anantharam, assistant general manager of SBI, Fort branch.

Rs 36-cr oil leak' in Howrah

If you see an oil tanker pull up near Naopala, close to Kolaghat, after 7.30 pm it may not always be for a tea break or a stretching of the limbs. Around 80-100 barrels of petroleum products, worth at least Rs 10 lakh, are pilfered every evening at this very spot, say sources in police and oil companies.

The racket that has gone from lakhs to crores over the last three years is allegedly operated by an Uttar Pradesh-based don and has the connivance of a section of oil tanker drivers, police, and employees of agencies that place bulk orders. The annual pilferage amounts to a whopping Rs 36 crore by rough estimates.

Incidentally, most of the pilfered products are from consignments booked by government agencies or private factories/contractors. Fuel station operators have managed to plug the problem by installing tamper-proof locks and seals on the vehicles that carry petrol and diesel.

Naopala, where the racketeers siphon off oil, is at the edge of Howrah, just ahead of the

Kolaghat bridge across Rupnarayan river. This area comes under Bagnan police station. The pilferage continues from 7.30 pm till the wee hours of the next day. One in every four tankers that crosses this stretch on National Highway 6 makes the unscheduled stop by the roadside. As much as 20,000 litres of petroleum products petrol, diesel, kerosene or bitumen bound for Kolkata from Indian Oil Corporation's refinery at Haldia is smuggled out.

Investigation team is looking into the matter.

10 on way to Tirumala die in accident

In a major road accident on the outskirts of the city, 10 persons belonging to three families of Ahmednagar in Maharashtra lost their lives in the wee hours of Sunday.

At about 2 am, a Scorpio, in which members of three families were travelling from Maharashtra to Tirupati, veered to the extreme right of the four-lane National Highway 9 (NH-9) near Pocharam village and had a head-on collision with a truck coming in the opposite direction (from Hyderabad side) at a very high speed.

After the collision, the truck, carrying granite, dragged the Scorpio for almost 80 feet. Due to the high-speed collision, the Scorpio got ripped into pieces and all the 10 persons travelling in it died on the spot.

'H1N1 strain may take milder form this year'

The state may have recorded three swine flu deaths in the last 10 days but health experts note that people have largely acquired 'herd immunity' against the virus this year. This would mean that the flu's impact would not be as widespread as last year and that it would manifest itself in a milder form in most cases.

Doctors say that the three deaths have been cases of sporadic infections, but note that since the H1N1 strain is the same as seen last year, people are showing immunity towards the virus. "The strain has not mutated so there is no need for worry. But those in the high risk group should be cautious. To further indicate that the strain is the same as last year's, Dr Subhakar says that the healthcare workers who had taken the vaccine did not get the infection despite coming in close contact with infected individuals.

Cops arrest six goons, foil bid to loot trader

Police on Saturday arrested six criminals when they were planning to loot cash from a businessman near Rajendra Nagar overbridge under Kadamkuan police station.

SSP said on Sunday that acting on a tip-off that some criminals had assembled at Pahalwan Ghat under Buddha Colony police station and were planning to loot cash from a businessman near Rajendra Nagar overbridge, a police team, led by City SP Manu Maharaj, carried out raid there along with members of anti-extortion cell and arrested the six criminals from there.

Security for docs sought

The Bihar State Health Service Association (BSHSA) at its executive committee meeting held at the IMA building here on Sunday demanded adequate security for doctors across the state.

The BSHSA demanded framing of a special security law and setting up of a special force within 15 days for the protection of doctors, failing which the doctors in each district of the state would wear black badges on July 10, take out a rally in Patna on July 20 and adhere to "work to rule" programme from July 26.

The BSHSA had earlier alleged indecent behaviour and attack on doctors and hospital properties by anti-social elements. The meeting, which was chaired by BSHSA president Dr Narayan Pandit, also condemned the police for slapping false charges on doctors in some cases to hide their own failure in checking such incidents.

Thieves target civil judge's house

Burglars struck at additional civil judge's house and decamped with cash, jewellery and other valuables worth over Rs 1 lakh in Indiranagar locality under Ghazipur police station area.

Additional civil judge, Anand Kumar is posted in Kanpur while his mother, Usha Kiran, stays at house number 9/6, Lohiya Vihar in Indiranagar.

Kumar and his mother were both in Kanpur when the incident took place. According to reports, Kumar's mother had gone to Kanpur about 10 days back.

However, neighbours suspecting theft informed Kumar, who arrived at his Indiranagar house only to find it burgled. The police said that miscreants decamped with cash and valuables, including a laptop, worth over Rs 1 lakh. According to the police, the thieves left some of the valuables, including a television, lying in the lawn, probably out of fear after they heard some vehicles arriving towards the house.

4 minors held for carrying out 21 robberies

The police arrested four teenaged robbers, who used to ride high-end motorcycles with big petrol tanks. Two of the accused are only 14 years old and the rest are 17-year olds and residents of Abadpura locality. The former are students of Class VII in a private school while the latter are school drop-outs.

Eight mobile sets along with motorcycles used in the crimes and four sharp-edged weapons were also recovered from the accused, who admitted their involvement in 21 robberies.

"Investigations revealed that motorcycles with big petrol tanks were being used in the robberies, where lonely migrant labourers were being targeted mostly during night. We received information that the robbers would enter Abadpura. As we zeroed in on them, we were shocked to discover that they were teenagers," said ACP (West) Ravinderpal Singh Sandhu. All four belonged to lower middle class families, the ACP added.

Six killed, 11 hurt in mishap

Six people were killed and 11 others were seriously injured when their jeep had a head-on collision with a pick-up truck on the Dausa-Manoharpur highway in Jamwaramgarh police station area in Jaipur rural on Sunday. The condition of four is critical.

Police said the passengers in the jeep were on their way to attend a wedding. By the time police reached the spot, the injured had been rushed to the NIMS and SMS Hospital by the villagers. The accident occurred around 6.30 pm near the Chilpilli turn close to Belod village, situated 30 km from Jamwaramgarh.

"The jeep was coming from Manoharpur while the pick-up truck was approaching from the

opposite direction. Both collided head-on. The jeep driver died on the spot, while five others died while undergoing treatment at the hospitals.

Assam flood situation worsens

The flood situation in Assam deteriorated further with the water level of the Brahmaputra and its tributaries rising alarmingly and inundating fresh tracts of land.

The worst affected districts are Lakhimpur and Jorhat in Upper Assam and the situation was turning worse in several other districts, officials said.

More than 70 villages have been inundated in Lakhimpur by the rising waters of Ranganadi, Dikroi, Kakoi and Singra, all tributaries of the Brahmaputra and the worst affected are the villages under the Naoboicha revenue circle.

In Jorhat district, Brahmaputra's tributary Saraikoni river has breached two embankments under Titabor sub-division inundating 40 villages including 15 schools and a sattrra (vaishnav monastery).

The other affected districts are Tinsukia, Dibrugarh, Dhemaji and Morigaon.

More than 50,000 people have been affected and road communication disrupted in several parts of these districts due to over-topping of the roads by flood water.

The state government has directed the district authorities.

Osama bin Laden is hiding in tribal areas of Pakistan: CIA

World's most wanted terrorist Osama bin Laden is hiding in Pakistan's rugged tribal areas, CIA chief said, even as he claimed that the al-Qaida is probably at its weakest point since 9/11 with only 60-100 militants left in Afghanistan.

"I think the estimate on the number of al-Qaida (in Afghanistan) is actually relatively small. I think at most, we're looking at maybe 60 to 100, maybe less. It's in that vicinity. There's no question that the main location of al-Qaida is in tribal areas of Pakistan," CIA director Leon Panetta, told in an interview.

Panetta said the al-Qaida leader Osama bin Laden is in deep hiding in the tribal areas of Pakistan, but did not give any further details.

18 militants killed in Afghanistan

The NATO-led troops eliminated 18 Taliban militants including two commanders in Afghanistan's southern Zabul province on Saturday.

Acting on intelligence reports the international troops pounded militants' hideouts in Shar-e-Safa area of the province on Friday night killing 18 rebels including two group commanders

Mullah Toorjan and Mullah Ahmad Shah on the spot.

Taliban militants fighting Afghan and NATO-led troops are yet to make comments.

Southern and eastern parts of the post-Taliban Afghanistan have been the scene of increasing Taliban-led insurgency over the past couple of years.
