## 2 held for using stolen credit cards in malls

Two cheats were arrested for allegedly duping owners of showrooms in a south Delhi mall by using stolen credit cards. The accused , identified as Vicky Arora (28) and Vikas (25), both residents of Faridabad, were arrested on Tuesday. Their accomplice, Vipin Pahwa, is on the run.

The arrests came following investigations into a complaint filed by a retail operation manager of a showroom at a mall in Saket. According to the complaint, two customers carrying American Express credit cards in the names of Mahender Ram and Pushpa Rani visited the store in April and purchased goods worth Rs 2.77 lakh. “When the showroom contacted the bank for release of the payment, the manager was told that the credit cards were already blocked. The IDs submitted by the customers were also found to be fake. Similar complaints were received from two other showrooms in the mall.

## Strike over but not flyers' woes: 19 flights cancelled

The suspension of the two day-long Air India (IA) strike on Wednesday evening only spelt more trouble for passengers in Delhi. On hearing the news, most presumed that flights would operate normally and reached the airport. Delhi, however, continued to work on a curtailed schedule and cancelled 19 flights on Thursday as well.

Officials said that flight operations would commence as per the normal schedule by Friday, though it would take a short while for the situation to normalise. Most flights to metro cities operated on Thursday . Initially, 24 flights were to be cancelled but by evening, five had been restored..

## Disaster averted after runway incursion by Indigo aircraft

A major disaster was averted at the Chhatrapati Shivaji International Airport on Wednesday night after an Indigo aircraft, which was supposed to be on the taxiway, entered the runway area.

Around the same time, a Jet Airways flight was scheduled to land on that runway, but the air traffic control (ATC) intercepted the plane and asked it to do a go-around to prevent a near-collision.

An Indigo Mumbai-Bangalore flight 6E 415 with over 150 passengers on board was set for take-off from Mumbai at 9pm on Wednesday. The ATC asked the flight to taxi via runway 14 of 14-32; it was to take a left to taxiway N1, which is before the intersection point of runways

14-32 and 09-27. From there it was supposed to proceed to the end of main runway 27 of 09-27.

#### **13 coaches of Express train derail after blast, 15 killed**

Fifteen people were killed as 13 coaches of a Mumbai-bound express train derailed after a blast on the railway lines and fell on the down line where it was hit by a goods train in the early hours today in West Midnapore district.

The blast took place at around 1.30 am when the Howrah-Kurla Lokmanya Tilak Gyaneshwari Super Deluxe Express was between Khemasoli and Sardiya stations of the Maoist-hit district.

### **Beware of faulty weighing machines in gold shops**

Next time when you purchase gold ornaments make sure to re-check the weight as several jewellery shops in city and suburbs are selling gold with defective weighing machines that show a variation between 50 mgs and 25 mgs less on the total quantity of gold purchased.

This was detected during raids conducted by special teams of Legal Metrology Department in connection with recent Akshaya Tritiya. The teams carried out raids on 102 jewellery shops and booked cases against 37 shopkeepers.

During inspections, it was found that machines showed 25 mgs variation if a customer purchased even a gold ring weighing one tola.

### **Tension brews, violence spreads to Kalupur**

An incident of stabbing was reported from the notorious Patwa Sheri area on Wednesday night as violence spread to the Kalupur on the third day. Five police personnel were injured in fresh clashes between two communities in Kalupur and the police opened 10 rounds of fire and lobbed 45 teargas shells.

Shahpur reported stone pelting incidents in the Golwaad and Bhilvaas areas, even as a sanitary worker was stabbed near Patwa Sheri in the Karanj area of the walled city late on Wednesday night.

However, the resilient public decided to get on with business and at least 80 per cent of the bazaars opened in Shahpur, Kalupur and Dariapur on Thursday. Meanwhile, the police arrested nine persons for inciting tension in the walled city.

#### **Suspicion of IED brings traffic to halt**

The traffic movement on the Jammu-Srinagar National Highway was disrupted for more than half-an-hour when a sniffer dog aroused suspicion of the Road Opening Parties (ROP) towards a possible IED planted near the highway at Rattanbas in Banihal yesterday morning.

During the routine patrol, a sniffer dog started sniffing a particular spot near the highway, adding the ROP got alerted and stopped the traffic movement immediately.

A bomb disposal squad was also requisitioned, but nothing was recovered after carefully digging the spot.

The traffic remained suspended from 8.30 am to 9 am. It may be stated here that the militants were always on a look out to plant mines and IEDs on the strategic highway to inflict maximum damage to the convoys of the security forces and the tourists.

Struck by a bullet in the waist, Sunil collapsed. Then, he was rushed to Bokaro General Hospital by his brother Anil, who was accompanying him. The criminals came on a motorbike, fired at Sunil and fled. He was later referred to Apollo Hospital.

**Manipur: Standoff continues, no solution in sight**

As Manipur's highway blockade enters its 46th day, the standoff continues. The state government is unable to break the deadlock in its hills, and is firm on its opposition to allow Naga underground leader to enter the state. The Centre is failing to convince Muivah to change his mind on visiting his village in Manipur.

Manipur's Chief Minister Ibobi Singh and NSCN(IM) chief Th Muivah have both scored political points. But the real problem remains unaddressed. It perhaps requires the Chief Minister to just reach out to the people, go there himself or send one of his ministers. That hasn't happened yet.

Meanwhile, both the highways are still under siege. A convoy of three hundred trucks was brought in by police escort and some essential items were airlifted, but the supply so far is grossly inadequate.

The economic loss due to the blockade is gone into several crores, and no solution seems to be in sight.

<b>Russia on alert after blast kills 7</b>			
Russian authorities on Thursday vowed to strike back after a bomb blast killed seven people and wounded dozens in the southern city of Stavropol minutes before a Chechen dance concert the night before.			
A bomb packed with steel pellets hidden in a juice carton went off near a cultural centre as locals were gathering for the performance of a renowned Chechen folk group.			
By Thursday morning, the death toll had risen to seven, including a 12-year-old girl, and 33 people remained hospitalised, many in critical condition.			
<b>7.4-magnitude quake hits South Pacific; tsunami warning issued</b>			
A shallow 7.4 earthquake struck off Vanuatu today, sparking a tsunami warning across the region.			
The quake at 04:14 am (2244 IST today) hit at a depth of 36 kilometres, 214 Kilometres north-west of Luganville, or 2,070 kilometres northeast of Brisbane, Australia, according to the US Geological Survey.			
The United States issued a tsunami warning for areas of the South Pacific including the Solomon Islands, Vanuatu and New Caledonia.			
The warning means coastlines near the epicentre could be subject to tidal waves within minutes. But the warning will not be expanded to other areas of the Pacific unless new data shows.
