Fake doctor's bid to practise foiled

The Delhi Medical Council has rejected the application of a “doctor” who came to its office here with a fake registration certificate from the Bihar Medical Council.

Imdad Alam came to Delhi with the intention of practicing medicine with a forged registration certificate from the Bihar Medical Council issued on April 21 this year. He claimed that he had obtained a degree in medicine from Xaviers International University, Bali, Goa, in 2008. He came to the Council's office on April 23 with registration no. 32310.

The Bihar Medical Council registration certificate looked suspicious and on verification it was found that the registration no. 32310 belongs to Dr. Pawan Kumar. Also Xaviers International University, Bali, Goa is not listed among recognised medical Institutions for awarding medicine degree.

Terror threat to Kolkata by IM

There is an imminent terror threat to Kolkata, the police said on Wednesday, urging citizens to be alert for any eventuality. The Indian Mujahideen has made the city its next target for a sensational attack, either in the form of serial blasts or kidnapping of high profile industrialists.

Recent call intercepts, corroborated by intelligence inputs, have led police to believe that IM modules have already finalized their plan for a series of subversive activities across Kolkata, including explosions in crowded areas and targeted strikes to cripple the administration. To terrorize the citizens, gunmen may fire indiscriminately at crowds, Mumbai-style.

Police have reasons to believe that an IM module has been assigned for the Kolkata operation and the manpower and logistic support have been already smuggled into the city.

Postal agent held for duping client of Rs 6.6 lakh

A 53-year-old woman has been arrested by Regent Park police on Monday for duping an employee of the US Cultural Office of Rs 6.6 lakh. Mridula Roy, the accused, works as an agent of post & telegraph department and allegedly withdrew Pulak Ranjan Pattanayak's money from his monthly income scheme account with forged papers. Preliminary probe hinted that an official of the P&T department is also involved in the forgery.

Man held for hoax bomb threats to schools

A 26-year-old man, who was wanted for sending hoax letters threatening to cause bomb explosions at schools, was held by North Beach police on Wednesday. According to police, Boopathi (26), was allegedly mentally ill after he lost his job at a TASMACH shop after being found responsible for financial irregularities at the store. He would send letters to schools protesting the supposed collection of large amounts for donation and demanded a sum of Rs 10 lakh to keep the matter under wraps. A list of three addresses would be affixed with each letter. On receiving one of the 15 letters sent out to schools, the head master of a school in Tondiarpet lodged a complaint with the local police station who traced the letters to Boopathi. A case has been registered. Further investigation is on.

The shut down will be effected in parts of Kothrud, Pimpri, Shivajinagar, padmavati, Parvati, Ahmednagar road, Bund Garden and Rasta Peth divisions. Information about the shut down will be available on toll free numbers 18002333435 or 9960677021 to 025 or 9960677049 for areas in Rasta Peth circle and on 9960677351 for areas in Ganeshkhind circle.

Meanwhile, a statement issued by the MSEDCL on Wednesday said that the MSETCL will undertake renovation of the Ganeshkhind-Chinchwad extra high voltage line on Thursday. As

a result power supply to Bijlinagar, JM Road, Modi Ganapati, police HQ, Haveli road, PMC, Shivajinagar gaathan, Chatushrungi, Shivajinagar bus stand, Senapati Bapat road, Wakdewadi, FC road, Kamshet, Talegaon, MIDC and Wadgaon Maval will be shut from 6 am to 8 pm.

In addition, supply from the 22 KV Tathawade-Pudumjee paper mill line will be shut from 6 am to 6 pm, while supply from the 220 KV Telco sub-station's PFC feeder will be shut from 8 am to 6 pm.

In Pune rural circle, power supply to Bhor, Haveli, Khed Shivapur, 22 KV Nasrapur, 33 KV Nira Deoghar supply lines will be shut from 10 pm on Wednesday to 10 pm on Thursday.

Woman duped of ornaments

Swindlers again duped a housewife of her ornaments on the pretext of polishing them at Maloya village here yesterday.

The police said the modus operandi and description of the two miscreants matched with those who had duped a woman in Sector 47 last week.

Anju Negi, a resident of Maloya, reported to the police that two persons in their early 20s, posing as marketing executives of a company, came to her house around 10.30 am. They told her that they wanted to demonstrate a powder that could polish her utensils.

Anju told the police that she gave a bowl to the two, who put some power in it and started cleaning it. They then told her to bring some gold ornaments, she wished to polish.

She handed over her gold chain and earrings. They then asked her to bring some water.

When she returned, they told her that they had put the ornaments in the bowl filled with water instructing her to keep these in water for 10 minutes and went away.

After 10 minutes, she checked the bowl and found nothing in it.

Cellphones worth Rs 7 lakh stolen from CG Road

A mobile phone store on CG Road was raided by thieves on Monday night. They decamped with 71 high-end mobile phones worth Rs 7.08 lakh. A complaint of theft has been registered at Navrangpura police station.

According to investigators, Rajesh Lalchandani, a resident of Sumeru Bungalows, Gurudwara Road, Vastrapur, owns a shop Raju Store on second floor of Navneet Plaza. When Malaram Meghwal, his employee came to the shop on Tuesday at 10.45 am, he found the locks missing from the shutter. He then called up Lalchandani.

In total, 71 expensive mobile phones of Nokia, Samsung and Motorola brands, all worth Rs 7.08 lakh were stolen. Significantly, there were more than 1,000 mobile phones in the shop but thieves only stole high-end handsets with chargers after tearing the covers apart.

The incident of night thefts has continued to nag the city. Despite recent orders for Sector I police officials of intensive night patrol, the thieves have continued to challenge the police, making law and order situation worse.

Fire breaks out at Arvind's Naroda unit

In a major fire at Arvind Mills' Naroda compound on Wednesday evening, several vehicles, administrative building's furniture and some of the records were damaged. Fire brigade officials fought for 2.5 hours to bring the situation under control.

The cause of fire is uncertain. In the primary investigation, it might be due to short-circuit on third floor housing accounting department. The fire has damaged a part of the building, furniture and vehicles parked outside. However, the major loss was administrative records that got damaged in the process

Twin suicide car bombings kill five in Baghdad
