**Warrants against real estate firm directors for cheating**

A Delhi court yesterday issued non-bailable warrants (NBWs) against three directors Delhi-based real estate company M/s Vighneshwara Developers Private Ltd for allegedly cheating a firm of over Rs 13 lakh in connection with a project.

Issuing the warrants against C. Daryao Singh, Sunil Dahiya and Sanjay Dahiya, additional chief metropolitan magistrate Ajay Pandey said, “There is sufficient material to call accused persons to face the trial for the offences of conspiracy, cheating, forgery and use of forged documents.”

The said project was being executed without taking requisite sanctions from various authorities. The complaint has been lodged by the director of M/s IMS Mercantile Private Ltd, Amit Saraff. According to him, his firm had paid Rs 13.5 lakh to the accused company for a property (with 1,000 sq feet built-up area) which lacked the requisite sanctions.

**Meerut trader shot in Ghaziabad**

A trader of Meerut, who had gone to Ghaziabad to attend a marriage, was shot at by unknown assailants on Saturday night. He was rushed to a Delhi hospital where he died on Sunday.

A case of murder has been registered against unknown assailants.

In his statement given to the police before dying, the victim, Feroze, said two unknown youths shot at him in the Shaid Nagar market area. A case of murder has been registered at the Sahibabad police station and investigations are on.

### **Rs 6.5L IMFL seized from farmhouse**

A huge liquor consignment of Rs 6.5 lakh was seized from a farmhouse near SG Highway on Monday. A surveillance squad of the director general of police, Gujarat, raided Rupali farm house in Greenwoods resort campus after a tip-off and seized 182 crates of Indian Made Foreign Liquor (IMFL) from the house. Police later said that the consignment belongs to a gang of bootleggers and they used to smuggle IMFL from Rajasthan.

The trio seemed to have got prior intimation of the raid and had escaped the farm house before the police team reached. "The three accused have several complaints under the Prohibition Act against them. They have also been booked under PASA," said police.

### **Kid, youth killed in CRPF firing, Kashmir on boil**

In a throwback to the Jammu and Kashmir government's mishandling of the 2009 Shopian rape and murder case, street protests over the killing of two youth in CRPF firing in Sopore degenerated into a full-blown riot on Monday in which two more people -- including a 9-year-old boy -- were killed. The toll from CRPF firing on protesters over the last fortnight, that underscores serious administrative lapses, has now climbed to eight.

### **Tata Steel guards, police open fire, Jamshedpur**

Police and Tata Steel security guards fired in the air after contract labourers, protesting against the alleged slapping of one of their colleagues, torched several vehicles on the company premises here and threw brickbats.

The trouble started when a company security guard slapped one of the labourers after they had a heated argument over entering the premises, East Singhbhum Deputy Commissioner Ravindra Agarwal and Superintendent of Police Navin Kumar Singh told journalists.

Labourers then set fire to several vehicles inside the premises and two police jeeps. Dozens of bicycles, motorcycles and an equipment for registering attendance were also damaged by them.

### **International call racket busted; 5 held, Roorkee**

The CBI has unearthed an international call racket operating from Roorkee in Uttarakhand by arresting five persons. The accused allegedly tampered with computers of a BSNL exchange to make global calls.

### **Rs 9 lakh jewellery theft reported**

A complaint regarding the theft of jewellery worth Rs 9 lakh has been lodged with Bhaktinagar police station. According to the police, in their joint statement, gold traders, Vishal Fichidiya and Renil, have alleged that one of their employees Josim decamped with the jewellery comprising of 34 earrings, 11 pendants, 250 nose rings and 177 rings, totalling Rs 9 lakh.

Josim was hired as a jewellery maker by the trader duo a few months ago. After earning their trust, Josim stole the jewellery and went absconding for 20 days. The traders then tried to trace him in his native village in West Bengal, but to no avail. Following this, they lodged the complaint.
