2 execs held for killing HR manager

With the arrest of two MNC employees, the police in Gautambudh Nagar claimed to have solved the murder case of a senior HR executive. The deceased, Pawan Upadhay, was found murdered near his residence in Surajpur. His Santro car was found abandoned several kilometres away.

The two accused were identified as Narinder Kumar and Pawan Kumar. On interrogation, they revealed that they along with the driver of the deceased had killed Pawan Upadhay on March 24.

They said they ran a transport company in association with the deceased and had a dispute with him over money. The accused had asked Rs 25,000 from the deceased, which he had refused, following which they took him to an under-construction house in Delta sector and killed him.

Fire breaks out near IP Bhavan at Delhi's ITO, 7 rescued

Fire broke out on the fourth floor of a building near IP Bhavan at ITO in central Delhi, a fire official said on Friday. Fire officials have rescued seven people, 17-18 fire tenders have been pressed into service. The building is known to house many government offices.

BEST officers arrested for Rs5.40 crore fraud

The Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of the crime branch on Friday arrested two employees of BEST, Shripad Puranik, deputy general manager (electric supply), and NA Sayyed, a retired chief engineer, for allegedly cheating the company of Rs5.40 crore.

A complaint was registered on February 13 by BEST chief security vigilance officer Ravishankar Kamble, 55, against Puranik, Sayyed, SJ Tandon, chief engineer (retired), and one Jatin Rawal, a distributor of foreign electric metres.

The scam took place at the BEST headquarters at Colaba. "Between October 2006 and October 2008, the officials bought electric meters and used fraudulent ways to get Rawal the contract.

Plastic unit gutted in Dankuni

The production area of a plastic factory in Dankuni was gutted in a blaze on Friday afternoon. Six fire tenders were deployed and the firemen took more than three hours to douse the flames. All the 130-odd workers were, however, safe.

On spotting the first flames around 11.45 am, workers of Polymac Pharmafomers Private Limited rushed out of their first-floor work station of the two-storey factory building. The floor was gutted and several cartons of finished plastic cups and plates the workers stored there were burnt along with machinery, said Lakhi Dey, one of the workers of the factory.

Before the fire engines came, farmers working on agricultural plots adjoining the factories sprayed water on the flames after fitting pipes to pump sets they use to irrigate their fields.

Truckers call off April 5 strike

Tamil Nadu State Lorry Owners' Federation on Friday called off its proposed indefinite strike from April 5 following talks with transport minister KN Nehru here.

The federation has earlier announced the agitation pressing various demands. It wanted the state government to prevent police harassment against lorry owners and drivers under the pretext of traffic and transport regulations, check irregularities at checkpoints, ensure that no police station under the pretext of jurisdiction would refuse to register FIR in case of robberies on national highways, to remove a rule that a pass in class VIII was necessary to get driving licence and not to seize vehicle documents and not to oppose anticipatory bail in case of accidents.

Friday prayers peaceful in riot-hit Hyderabad

Friday prayers passed off peacefully in riot-hit areas of Hyderabad as the curfew continued for the fourth day without any relaxation.

Police had made massive security arrangements in view of the Friday prayers. Though the curfew was not relaxed thus preventing huge congregations at major mosques, Muslims offered prayers either in neighbourhood mosques or in their homes.

Police allowed over 200 people including some leaders of Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimeen (MIM) to offer prayers at the historic Mecca Masjid, where thousands gather every Friday.

The prayers were also offered at dozens of mosques in interior areas in Muslim-majority old city. However, in communally sensitive areas, people preferred to offer namaz at home.

Jamaia Nizamia, the famous seat of Islamic learning, had issued a "fatwa" (religious edict) that Friday prayers were not must for Muslims in curfew-bound areas. Mufti Khaleel Ahmed, head of Jamia Nizamia, said Friday prayers in mosques are a must only when they can be offered without any disturbance and without endangering lives.

Following the edict, police had also appealed to Muslims to offer prayers at home. Police and paramilitary forces kept a tight vigil to maintain peace.

Relieved over peaceful conduct of prayers, Police Commissioner A.K. Khan told that curfew would be relaxed for longer durations Saturday. The curfew was relaxed for two hours in all

17 police station areas of south zone Thursday while no relaxation was given in the remaining eight police station areas.

Pune woman gangraped in cab, two held

A 25-year-old postgraduate in hospitality management was driven around Pune for eight hours by three people who allegedly took turns to rape her inside the vehicle in Hinjewadi IT Park area late on Thursday night.

They then dropped the married woman near her aunt's house on Thursday night. The victim got married two years ago and had returned to her hometown Nagpur just a month ago after staying with her husband in the US. She came to Pune a fortnight back looking for a job and was staying with her aunt.

The woman, an MBA in hospitality management, had gone out for an interview in Wakad area, after waiting for a public transport for half-an-hour, she took a lift in the vehicle when she was abducted and allegedly raped by three persons, who too were seated in the taxi along with her, on Thursday night.

Fire in industrial unit in Naroda

A portion of a paints company processing plant was gutted in an industrial fire in Naroda on Friday morning. Fire brigade officials controlled the flames after three hours of operation.

According to Ahmedabad Fire and Emergency Services (AFES) officials, they got a call at 11.05 am on Friday that Asiatic Colour Chem, a paints processing unit in Naroda GIDC phase I, had caught fire.

When fire officials reached the spot, fire had engulfed the processing unit and storage area where the processed paint was kept. A large part of paints was damaged in the incident. The cause of fire could not be known immediately. However, fire brigade officials believe it to be a short-circuit in the plant. Nobody was injured in the incident

Terror on tracks: Ultras target Kashmir rail link

- Blow up Baramulla-Qazigund line;
- HM hand suspected;
- no casualties;
- 2 trains cancelled

For the first time since the start of railway services in the Kashmir valley, militants blew up part of the Baramulla-Qazigund line near the Kakpora railway station in Pulwama district late Thursday night, disrupting traffic for several hours.

The militants detonated a powerful Improvised Explosive Device (IED) on the line around 9.15 pm yesterday, damaging around two feet of track.

Initial probe indicates that there was a possibility of local taxi operators allegedly colluding with Hizbul Mujahideen ultras, who have a presence in the area, and targeting the railway track as their business had been hit badly because of the train services. A mixture of RDX had been used in the IED and it was connected to a wire traced to a nearby hillock from where the explosion was triggered.

Four Lashkar militants, jawan killed

Security forces gunned down four more militants of the Lashkar-e-Toiba (LeT) in Telna forests of Rajouri district yesterday, taking the number of militants killed in the Rajouri-Kalakote-Reasi region in a week to 16. However, a soldier was also killed in Friday's encounter. Four terrorists of the Lashkar-e-Toiba, all foreign mercenaries from Pakistan, were gunned down in Telna forests of Rajouri.

Israel warns of new Gaza assault after air strikes

Israel on Friday threatened a widescale military operation against the Gaza Strip after a string of air strikes which injured three Palestinian children following rocket attacks from the enclave.

Israel's deputy prime minister, Silvan Shalom, warned that the military would soon launch a new offensive on the Hamas-ruled Gaza Strip unless the rocket fire was halted.

17-yr-old 'baby-faced' widow bombed Moscow Metro

Investigators believe that one of two women suicide bombers in the subway attacks that killed 39 people in Moscow this week was a baby-faced 17-year-old girl from a Muslim region who was the widow of an insurgent leader killed by Russian forces.
