Man robbed of Rs 5 lakh

Three unidentified assailants allegedly attacked and robbed a manager working with Bharat Petroleum of Rs 5 lakh in the national Capital.

According to police, the incident took place right outside the State Bank of India in the Prashant Vihar area of outer district this morning.

The victim Mahavir Jain told police that the trio after robbing him fled on a bike which they had parked nearby. Police said that they were reported about the incident around 11 pm.

Maid job racket busted

The south Delhi police has busted a racket of placement agencies which are involved in duping people in the name of providing maid, caretaker, nanny, nurses. More than 100 people have reportedly been duped in and around NCR so far.

According to police, two people, Salim Turkey (35) and Bahuran Kumar (25), have been arrested in this connection.

HGS Dhaliwal, DCP (south) said that one Jagdish Narayan, a retired government official had filed a complaint with the Sarojini Nagar police station stating therein that he had received a pamphlet in his newspaper regarding an advertisement about the availability of housemaids through a registered agency, Jay Placement Service, having its office at Lajpat Nagar.

1,135 students got jobs in Maharashtra using fake marksheets: CBI report

A total of 1,135 students have secured jobs submitting fake marksheets after passing out from various universities in Maharashtra, according to a report prepared by the CBI.

The fake marksheet scam came to fore after an investigation by the CBI on the direction of the Bombay High Court on a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) in 2007.

The PIL had alleged that many of the employees working in government and private sectors had got the job after submitting bogus documents, and sought a probe.

Security beefed up across Mumbai after fidayeen alert

Security was beefed up across the city on Tuesday, especially at railway stations, following a fidayeen alert received by the police headquarters.

Around 10 am, the state police headquarters received an input saying members of a fidayeen unit would attack Mumbai, targeting major railway stations like CST, Dadar, Churchgate and Mumbai Central.

The railway police with the help of Railway Protection Force (RPF) personnel promptly intensified security at all railway stations.

The railway police also carried out extensive checks on the station premises with the help of sniffer dogs and the Bomb Detection and Disposal Squad (BDDS). Passengers' bags were also checked at all stations.

Mumbai Railway Police Commissioner TA Chavan personally visited CST, Churchgate and Mumbai Central stations to check the security arrangements.

Both the Central and Western Railway administration appealed to commuters via the public address system not to touch suspicious, unclaimed articles lying around.

Commuters were asked to report any such articles to the Government Railway Police (GRP), Railway Protection Force (RPF) in uniform or the on-duty stationmaster.

Man dupes bank staff, arrested in Mumbai

The Dindoshi police arrested a Mira Road resident on Monday for cheating the manager of a private bank of Rs 50,000 after promising to provide loose change.

Police said Baburam Kashyap, the complainant and a manager of a nationalised bank at Malad (East), said that on October 18, the accused, Arun Agrawal, came to the bank and introduced himself as Bharat Jain. He said he was a businessman and wanted to open two fixed deposits of Rs 25 lakh each with the bank.

PSBJC calls indefinite blockade

The Maoist-backed Police Santrash Birodhi Janasadharaner Committee (PSBJC) called for an indefinite blockade in the three districts of Paschim Medinipur, Bankura and Purulia in West Bengal from Tuesday in protest against the death of two of its supporters in police firing at Barikul in Bankura on Monday.

According to the police, a large group of PSBJC supporters rallied to the Barikul police station on Monday with a gherao programme and opened fire on the police when stopped from entering the thana premises.

The police also retaliated, starting a gun-battle. Seven policemen and three PSBJC supporters suffered bullet injuries. Two of the PSBJC supporters later succumbed to their injuries.

Fire Accident: Hospital turns into deathtrap

One person died and 38 were injured, including three nurses who are critically, in a major fire at Park Healthcare Hospital in

Somajiguda on Tuesday morning. Acase under section 304 (A) (causing death by negligence)

has been filed against the hospital management.

The fire engulfed a major portion of the five-storey hospital's first floor, along with some medical equipment and furniture on the other floors. While fire department said they were assessing the damage, the cause still remains a mystery with officials attributing it to a short-circuit and others to a diesel generator on the ground floor.

Wanted criminal shot dead in encounter

Police in Lucknow shot dead a listed history-sheeter carrying a cash reward of Rs 10,000 on his head, in the small hours of Tuesday. Police said that the cellphone recovered from the possession of the slain gangster was the one robbed from the house of Rajjab in Thakurganj during the triple murder, in which Rajjab, his wife and grand-daughter were killed on the intervening night of January 28/29.

The Tuesday morning encounter took place after a hot pursuit following a shootout in Kakori police circle late on Monday night. Reports were received that three persons -- including one armed with a firearm -- riding a motorcycle had opened fire at three others also on a motorcycle passing from Kakori Road.

4 held for stabbing vendor to death

In less than 24 hours after a youth was stabbed to death by a gang of extortionists in the Industrial Area last night, the police yesterday claimed to have solved the murder case by arresting four persons allegedly involved in the crime.

The SSP stated that a six-member gang aged between 18 and 25 years was involved in the murder. The accused have been identified as Mukesh Kumar, Amar Bahadur, Rajiv Kumar and Kamlesh. Efforts were on to trace the other two — Guru Dutt Mishra, alias Prince, and Bharosa.

Petrol pump cashier shot dead, robbed of Rs 3.5 lakh

A cashier of a petrol pump at Khokhra was shot dead by a man who hitched a ride on his scooty when he was going to deposit the pump's earnings in the bank.

Bipin Thakkar, 45, a resident of Mangalam Society, Ghodasar, worked as a cashier-cum-manager at Sheth Mehta and Co near Anupam Cinema in Khokhra and used to regularly deposit the collections in the bank. On Monday, around 10.50 am he was headed for the State Bank of India's Khokhra branch on his scooty with the cash bag containing Rs 3.5 lakh when he gave a lift to a man in his 30s.

Two men then came on a bike and tried to corner him as the pillion rider tried to snatch the cash bag at gunpoint. When Thakkar resisted, he shot him through the neck from behind with a .12 mm bore gun, as the cashier slumped on his two-wheeler, dead. The three then ganged up and sped towards Hatkeshwar.

Brothers looted of Rs 8 lakh in Morbi, Gujarat

Unidentified robbers looted two brothers of Rs 8 lakh cash in Morbi city on Sunday night. The robbers attacked the brothers injuring one of them seriously.

Haresh and Bechar Kanjariya were going on their bike when three to four unidentified persons attacked them and looted the cash bag full. The bag contained the stolen amount, while Rs 2 lakh which the brother duo was carrying on themselves was saved.

According to police, Haresh works as post office agent and Bechar is an LIC agent. The duo had collected money from customers and was driving towards their residence in Hadani Vadi area from Jeksini Vadi. They were carrying Rs 10 lakh of which put they had kept Rs 2 lakh in their pockets and the remaining in a bag. When they reached near Sardar Mill on Shanala Road around 11 pm the robbers attacked them with iron pipes, bats, wooden sticks and snatched the bag before escaping. The brothers were injured badly.

Suspected US drone strikes kill at least 29 in Pakistan

Multiple missile strikes carried out by suspected US pilot less drone aircraft killed at least 29 people in Pakistan's restive tribal region Tuesday, a Pakistani intelligence official said.

Several more people were injured in the air attacks that took place in at least four villages of North Waziristan district, a known sanctuary of Taliban and Al Qaeda militants conducting cross-border raids on US-led NATO forces in Afghanistan.

At least eight drones took part in the attack, and they have fired some 18 missiles at three training camps of Taliban, their two vehicles and some bunkers. Taliban militants have fired at the US aircraft from some of these bunkers. The militants shot down one drone on January 24.
