**Fake soft drink unit busted in northeast Delhi**

This will make you choke on your cold drink. Delhi Police busted a gang on Friday that was manufacturing fake aerated drinks in Meet Nagar in northeast Delhi and supplying them to various areas in the city, primarily north and northeast Delhi and Ghaziabad.

Fakes of major soft drink brands were found during the raid which happened barely a month after an unsuccessful raid on a similar suspected racket operating in the same area, claimed residents. What is even more worrying is that several other gangs may be involved in this racket.

**Fake visa racket busted, three held**

A fake visa racket has been busted with the arrest of three youths, including a Nigerian and a woman. They allegedly used to cheat people by promising them jobs in Canada, America and European countries. Agu Rufus Ikechukwa (28), Gautam Kumar (26) and Riya Rosy Chettri (22) used to charge Rs 20 lakh to Rs 25 lakh as fees.

The arrests came following investigations into a complaint filed by R Suresh and his friends from Chennai and Canadian High Commission. Suresh along with nine others applied for a job through internet in a Toronto-based company in April 2010 and they received the employment contract letter from executive director of the company.

Later on behalf of the company, one Thomas contacted them and asked them to apply for visa through his contact, Neil Narcis, in Delhi. For this, they paid Rs 15 lakh to Narcis and another Rs 2.35 lakh to Riya alias Roshni. "She handed over two passports with Canadian visa. The remaining passports were to be handed over after 4-5 days following full payment. Thereafter, the gang stopped responding on phone. Suspicious, Suresh along with his friends made enquiries in the Canadian High Commission and found that the visa was fake,'

**State govt to move court to pre-empt July 5 bandh**

The state government has decided to use legal means to restrain opposition parties from going ahead with their bandh on July 5. The BJP has called for a nationwide bandh to protest the recent fuel price hike. In Maharashtra, the Shiv Sena and more recently, the MNS, have announced support for the bandh.

Although the government has promised that all essential services will be maintained and security beefed up for buses and trains to run smoothly, it's another matter if cabbies, who have faced the brunt of the two Senas earlier, will turn out on the streets. Automen are likely

to take a decision today on whether to operate or not on Monday.

The state has asked all government staff to report for work, but may allow schools and colleges to remain closed on July 5 as precautionary measures. However, no notification has been sent out in this regard so far. Shopkeepers have agreed to keep their doors open if they are provided adequate security.

#### **Maoist network in Kolkata suburbs**

The Left extremists are slowly establishing their network in the suburbs in and around Kolkata, West Bengal Director-General of Police Bhupinder Singh said here on Friday.

Talking to reporters, he said the areas being scanned and covered by the rebels spread right up to the Sundarbans. "They seem to be spreading their network in places like Baruipur, Kakdwip, Sundarbans and Diamond Harbour in the South 24 Parganas district," he said, adding that the State's southern-most district was separated from Purba Medinipur by the Hooghly river and this proximity might have made South 24 Parganas an easy target.

Their modus operandi is to establish rapport (with locals), mark hide-outs, locate courier and linkmen and then start stashing arms. In the Jangamahal area in the LWE strongholds, the entry tactic was through cultural shows, folk theatre and music.

#### **Theft by domestic help on the rise; Cop warns people to exercise caution**

Between January 1 and May 15 this year, police have recorded 15 cases of theft of jewellery and cash by domestic help from homes across the city.

Warning people to be careful while hiring domestic help, commissioner of police T Rajendran said on Friday during a press conference that cases of theft involving maids were on the rise in the city.

"A gang of women who approach households posing as maids is active and there has been a rise in cases involving these people," he said. "Employers should not shy away from checking the antecedents of maids," Rajendran said.

He said employers could give photographs and addresses of prospective maids to the local police station for verification. "Many don't even know the correct name and address of their maids. People should be more careful," he said.

### Bandh likely to shut down city

Autos will remain off the road. A majority of schools will be closed. In all likelihood, the dawn-to-dusk Bharat bandh on Monday will immobilize the city.

On Friday, KSRTC and BMTTC chiefs were awaiting instructions from the government on whether to ply or not.

But many private schools were more decisive, and officially announced that Monday would be a holiday. Some institutions said they were waiting for the education department to take a final decision.

### FOR INFOTECH EMPLOYEES

Infosys Technologies said they were re-arranging transport arrangements so that employees could come in early and leave after the bandh ends at 6 pm.

Wipro said they plan to work. But the company as also several other firms, said they are watching the situation, and would take a final call later, depending on the law and order situation. Some firms said they are considering bringing critical staff to the office the night before, and make overnight arrangements for them, so they can work on Monday.

### **Top Maoist leader shot dead in AP**

In a major setback to the Maoist movement, its top leader and Politburo member Cherukuri Rajkumar, alias Azad, was killed in an encounter in the Jogapur forest area on the Andhra Pradesh-Maharashtra border today.

Azad was involved in 16 cases, including several attacks targeting high-profile politicians. He was also one of the accused in the botched assassination attempts on former Chief Ministers N Chandrababu Naidu and M Janardhan Reddy. He was also believed to have masterminded the killing of Congress MLA Narsa Reddy and 10 others in August, 2005, that prompted the government to re-impose ban on the Maoist outfit.

#### **Who was Azad?**

Azad, a post-graduate engineer, was a spokesman of the CPI (Maoist) central committee and considered a close confidant of Maoist chief Muppala Laxman Rao, alias Ganapathi. He was in charge of a guerrilla zone comprising Maoist stronghold areas in Kerala, Karnataka and Tamil Nadu.

### **Traffic curbs for President's visit to city**

The city police have imposed restrictions on vehicular traffic on July 4 and 5 in view of President Pratibha Patil's visit to the city.

Police commissioner AK Khan said traffic will either be stopped or diverted at some places. On July 4, traffic movement will be restricted from 2 pm to 3 pm from Begumpet Airport to Raj Bhavan via Old airport junction, Shyamlal Building, HPS Begumpet Flyover - Greenlands junction, Rajiv Gandhi Statue, Yashoda Hospital at Somajiguda and Raj Bhavan up to V V Statue at Khairatabad.

On the same day, traffic will not be allowed between 7.30 pm and 8.15 pm from Raj Bhavan to Jubilee Hall via Raj Bhavan, V V Statue, Necklace Road, NTR Garden, Lumbini Park, Telugu Talli flyover, Old Secretariat gate, Iqbal Minar, RBI, Ravindra Bharathi, Old PCR Osmania gate and Jubilee Hall. As per convenience, the traffic will be stopped between Jubilee Hall and Raj Bhavan as the President of India will return to Raj Bhavan, a press release said.

On July 5, traffic will be restricted from Raj Bhavan to Ravindra Bharathi from 11 am to 11.45 am. No vehicular movement will be allowed from Raj Bhavan, V V Statue, Necklace Road, NTR Garden, Lumbini Park, Telugu Talli flyover, Old Secretariat, Iqbal Minar and RBI up to Ravindra Bharathi.

On the same day, traffic will not be allowed from Ravindra Bharathi to Begumpet airport from 12 noon to 1 pm via Ravindra Bharathi, RBI, Iqbal Minar, Old Secretariat, Lumbini Park, NTR Garden, Khairatabad Flyover, V V Statue, Raj Bhavan, Yashoda Hospital, Rajiv Gandhi Statue, Green Lands, Begumpet Flyover, HPS and airport junction.

#### **Heavy rain lashes coastal Andhra, Telangana**

- Collectors of vulnerable districts asked to be on vigil and shift people from low-lying

areas

The South-west monsoon turned “vigorous” over the State on Friday under the influence of an ‘upper air circulation’ over the Bay, causing heavy/widespread rain over the coastal Andhra and Telangana regions.

Sircilla, in Karimnagar district, recorded a heavy rainfall of 130 mm during the 24-hour period ending 8.30 am Friday. There was 90 mm rainfall at Naryankhed, 80 mm at Koida and 70 mm each at Hyderabad, Madhira and Tiruvur. Many places in the regions received rain up to 60 mm each. As a result, tanks, streams and rivulets received sudden inflows. Low-lying areas in several places, including Hyderabad, were inundated. M. Satyakumar, Director, State Meteorological Centre, said the heavy rain would continue over Telangana and coastal Andhra on Saturday and Sunday.

#### **Opposition parties to hold demonstrations as part of nation-wide bandh'**

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), Shiv Sena, Republican Party of India, Communist Party of India-Marxist and Bharatiya Gareeb Party, among other opposition parties, will carry out a nation-wide bandh' on July 5, to protest against the rising price of fuel and basic commodities and rising inflation.

In Pune, opposition parties have planned demonstrations in different parts of the city on July 3. The BJP and Shiv Sena are making appeals to citizens and institutions. In Pune, volunteers from the BJP and Shiv Sena will distribute pamphlets and organise meetings at public places to spread the word.

Except for railways, hospitals and ambulance services, they said are requesting traders' organisations, schools and colleges to remain closed on that day. The Republican Party of India, Pune office, is planning a Railway Roko' protest on the morning of July 5. Workers from the party will stage a peaceful protest at the Pune Railway Station.

They will have to take a left turn at sector 21/22/17/18 roundabout. To enter the ISBT-17 lane, they will have to turn right from the small roundabout in front of Gurdial petrol pump.

Instructions regarding the diversions were issued by SP (traffic) Hardeep Singh Doon.

Officials said heavy police force would be deployed at all the said routes for avoiding untoward incidents.

### **Hurriyat March: Curfew in entire Srinagar**

Apprehending trouble ahead of the proposed march to Eidgah called by the APHC, curfew was imposed on the summer capital since early morning of Friday. At least 20 persons, including eight cops and CRPF men, were injured in clashes with protesters defying curfew in different parts of the Valley yesterday.

The police said incidents of stone throwing were reported from Shankergund in Sopore, Trehgam in Kupwara district, Samboora in Pulwama district and Choon in Budgam district.

However, the police and the CRPF chased away the miscreants. Eight policemen and two civilians were injured in these clashes, a police spokesman said, describing the situation across the Valley as by and large peaceful.

There was no relaxation in curfew in other major towns of the Valley, including Sopore and Baramulla in north Kashmir and Anantnag in south Kashmir. Other areas in south Kashmir, including Pulwama, Kulgam, Kokernag, Bejbehara, Achabal, Dooru and Koimoh, also reeled under the restrictions following the death of three youths in Anantnag on Tuesday.

After the late evening protests in the summer capital on Wednesday and the proposed march by the APHC to Eidgah today, the district administration imposed curfew on the entire district since last night. The areas under seven police stations of the city had been under curfew for the past five days.

#### **Death toll in Lahore blast 41**

At least 41 people were killed and nearly 175 injured in the suicide bomb attack on the Data Darbar complex in Lahore on Thursday night. The bombings at the shrine of the Persian Sufi saint Hazrat Syed Ali bin Usman Hajweri are being seen as not just an attack on a crowded place but an assault on the tolerant Sufi tradition.

The bombers — one of whom has been identified as a local by his brothers — struck close to midnight on Thursday, the main time of congregation at the shrine. On Thursdays, devotees

queue up through the night in the hope of blessings of the Sufi saint revered as the guardian of Pakistan's cultural capital.

The bombers detonated their suicide jackets separately; killing many on the spot and seriously injuring others. Since the gathering was nearly 3,000 strong, the explosions triggered a commotion and many were injured in the stampede that ensued.
