Rs 34 lakh looted in SBI parking lot

Three armed men allegedly looted Rs 34 lakh from three employees of a petrol station in the parking lot of a State Bank of India (SBI) branch here yesterday.

The police said 3 people had gone to deposit the cash of three days' sale from the petrol pump of Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited to the SBI branch when the incident took place.

Around noon when Punit stopped the car in the parking lot of the bank near Pari Chowk, three robbers, armed with pistols, overpowered the cashier and snatched the bag containing the cash. They fled on a motorcycle after taking the bag. The employees informed the company manager about the incident who called the police.

Dera unrest: Gurgaon on alert

In view of the unrest among the followers of Dera Sachha Sauda in Sirsa, the local administration and the police authorities have sounded an alert in the district with a view to preventing damage to public property.

Deputy commissioner Rajender Kataria yesterday called a meeting of all district officers at the local Mini-Secretariat and asked them to remain alert in view of the prevailing situation.

Though the situation in Gurgaon is by and large normal and peaceful, followers of the dera have been damaging public property in different parts of the state...so the officers here too are vigilant.

S Korean molested, robbed on local

A 22-year-old South Korean national was allegedly molested and robbed in a running local train on Monday, while she was travelling alone on Holi. The victim has been in Mumbai since October on a tourist visa. GRP officials arrested the culprit, within six hours of the crime.

According to the police, A S. Korean National, has been residing in India since October 2009 on a tourist visa. After celebrating Holi at Colaba, Kee came to Mumbai Central along with her friend Aditi. Aditi left for home and Kee took a train to Bandra around 11.45am.

She was alone in the first-class ladies' compartment of the Malad-bound fast local. Upadhyay too boarded the train when it started. He threatened her and asked her to hand over the possessions. Although she didn't really understand what Upadhyay told her in Hindi, assessing the adverse situation Kee refused to budge.

When Upadhyay allegedly tried to manhandle her, she bit him in the hand. But the attacker snatched a mobile phone and Rs123 from her. He then jumped off the train when it slowed down at Dadar station. Kee later lodged a complaint.

Incidents of stone-throwing reported in the city

Muslims in the city on Tuesday expressed their anger against the publication of Bangladeshi writer Taslima Nasreen's article in a Kannada daily and urged the State police to initiate action against the newspaper.

Stray incidents of stone-throwing on Bangalore Metropolitan Transport Corporation (BMTC) buses and attempts to disrupt traffic were reported in the city.

The situation is, however, peaceful in the city. Meanwhile, Muslims tried to hold protest rallies at J.C. Nagar, Tannery Road, Kalasipalya, J.C. Road, near Urvashi cinema, Gurappanapalya, Goripalya and at other places but were prevented as a ban order was in place under Section 144 of the Code of Criminal Procedure.

Later they forced shops on J.C. Road and a few other places to down their shutters, raising slogans against the daily. Some 14,000 police personnel have been deployed across the city and additional security has been provided in vulnerable areas.

2 newspaper offices attacked in Mangalore, Karnataka

The offices of two newspapers here were attacked by masked men on Tuesday night. At 9 p.m., four masked men forced their way into the office of Kannada Prabha and set fire to the furniture in the lobby. They also damaged five computers, printers, and glass panels.

About 30 minutes later, the office of evening paper Jaykirana in an apartment complex was attacked by four men. Computers and furniture were damaged and an employee sustained minor injuries. Apartment residents said a large number of men on motorcycles waited outside during the attack. Offices of some newspapers claimed they received threat calls.

Superintendent of Police A.S. Rao told reporters the attacks appeared to have been carried out by the same gang.

Even as Nepal's government said it would beef up security following the murder of an Indian-origin media tycoon and businessman in southern Nepal, the Indian managing director of an Indian-owned private medical college in Nepal was shot at in the capital on Tuesday but escaped unscathed.

Nagender K Pampaty, an MBA associated with the College of Medical Sciences in Bharatpur town in Chitwan district, was shot at in Lazimpath, the most secure area of the capital, around 6.30pm on Tuesday by two men driving towards him on a motorcycle. Though the car was damaged, Pampaty was however unhurt.
