### AIIMS becomes dengue den, 1 dead

AIIMS, the country's premier medical institute, seems to have become a hub of dengue cases. On Sunday, a 25-year-old son of an AIIMS staffer died of the disease and family members of many doctors living on campus have been diagnosed positive.

Doctors say as many as 40 to 45 dengue cases have been reported from the campus, Meanwhile, Delhi on Sunday reported 59 new cases of dengue, taking to 800 the number of people infected so far by the mosquito-borne disease. There have been two dengue deaths so far, as per official records.

### Metro from CP to Gurgaon next weekend

From the next weekend, commuters can hope to reach Gurgaon from the city's shopping hub of Connaught Place in less than an hour as the Central Secretariat-Qutub Minar corridor is

likely to be opened by that time.

The inauguration of the 12.53 km line will take place after the Commissioner of Metro Rail Safety R K Kardam inspects the entire corridor on Monday and Tuesday and give his mandatory safety clearance.

Once the Central Secretariat-Qutub Minar corridor is opened and integrated with the existing 14.47 km Qutub Minar-HUDA City Centre line, it would drastically reduce travel time between Delhi and its satellite city of Gurgaon.

It will take less than an hour for commuters to reach the Millennium City of Gurgaon from the capital's shopping hub of Connaught Place once the line becomes operational, as compared to at least 90 minutes by road.

#### **Woman Maoist leader arrested in Kolkata**

A hardcore woman Maoist leader from Bihar, Chameli Devi, was arrested from this West Bengal capital on Sunday, police said.

Acting on intelligence inputs, policemen from Bihar's Munger district, teamed up with Special Task Force (STF) personnel of the Kolkata Police and raided a slum in the northern part of the city.

"Chameli was involved in eight cases, including the explosion in the sub-divisional office at Abeli in Kharagpur of West Midnapore district," an STF official said.

A resident of Vikhadi village in Bihar, Chameli was active not only in her home district but also in Jhajha and Jamui of Jamui district.

**Credit card cheat: Tollywood director Teja cheated to the tune of Rs 6.2 lakh**

Police arrested a private bank sales executive for duping Tollywood director Teja to the tune of Rs 6.2 lakh.

The sales executive, Avinash Gupta, 29, of Moti Nagar, went to Teja last year to renew the latter's two credit cards. But during the process of renewal, Gupta gave his own residential address instead of Teja's for card delivery. The credit cards were delivered to Gupta's residence in August 2009.

Using those credit cards, Gupta made several purchases. As the due amount rose to Rs 6.2 lakh, bank representatives met Teja last week to verify.

The bank staff conducted a probe into the issue and found that it was the handywork of Avinash Gupta. A complaint was lodged with the Jubilee Hills police and Avinash was

arrested from his house on Sunday under the charges of cheating, impersonation and forgery.

#### **Reds damage cellphone tower**

Armed Maoists blew up the cellphone tower of a private company on Saturday night at Sonaul village, 50 km from here, in East Champaran district. However, there was no casualty. Maoists had given a call for Bihar bandh on Saturday to protest the arrest of Musafir Sahani, regional secretary of CPI( Maoist), by East Champaran police in Kolkata on August 21.

According to villagers, around 50 Maoists invaded the village in the mid-night and detonated the cellphone tower. They were shouting slogans against the police and government.

Suspected Maoists late Saturday night torched five vehicles of a road construction firm at Annour-Abhiman village under Annour PS area in Saran district.

The firm had refused to pay 2% of the amount sanctioned for construction of four-lane road between Siwan and Dariapur to the Maoists. The loss to the company has been estimated to be over Rs 1 crore.

**Another ATM fraud: Rs 15,000 withdrawn from account of Air Force man**

In yet another incident, an Air Force personnel lost Rs 15,000 to ATM fraudsters through the suspected cloning of his ATM card even as the State Bank of India (SBI) claimed to have deployed security guards at its ATM counters in the tricity and the police is clueless about the identity of the miscreants.

The complainant, Ram Chander, reported to the police that he had lost Rs 15,000. He said he had withdrawn Rs 15,000 from the Sector 32 ATM of the SBI at 11.45 am. A guard was sitting outside the cabin. Again in the afternoon, he withdrew Rs 1,800 from the same ATM and to his shock, he found that Rs 15,000 had been withdrawn from his account between these two transactions.

**Footage quality poor**

Sources in the cyber crime investigation cell of the Chandigarh police said the placement of cameras and lights at the ATM resulted in poor quality of the footage, which was a major hurdle in identifying the miscreants. It was noticed that the cameras were not positioned at the right angles and the light did not focus on the face of the user of the ATM. Cameras installed in the machines were also not of high resolution. A police officer said the bank should ensure that no one should cover his or her face while making transactions at ATMs.

### Gujjars plan stir in front of Vidhan Sabha on Tuesday

Members of the All-India Gujjar Arakshan Samiti will be holding a peaceful agitation in front of the Rajasthan Vidhan Sabha on Tuesday.

The agitation is part of the plan of the Samiti to press for its demands of a 5% reservation for members of the community in the state among other things.

Addressing a press conference, Ramvir Singh Bhiduri, chief patron of the samiti, said, "Strong resentment exists among the community for the failure of the government to bring about the promised reservation. The agitation would be peaceful, but if the government ignores our demands we will later take to the streets."

A dharna would be staged outside the assembly from 12 pm on that day and would continue in various forms till the demands are met.

Prime on the list of demands is a 5% reservation for members of the community.

### Six terrorists killed in Kashmir's Uri sector as Army foils infiltration bid

The army Sunday foiled a major infiltration bid by separatist guerrillas in north Kashmir's Uri sector, killing six of the intruders, defence sources said here. The gunfight was continuing late Sunday night.

A major infiltration bid was foiled by the alert army troops in Uri sector of the LOC (Line of Control). A group of heavily armed infiltrators crossed over to this side of the LOC after which they were challenged and asked to surrender.

The infiltrators opened fire at the troops, triggering a fierce encounter that is still going on in the area.

Six intruders have so far been killed but their identity would only be established after the operation ends in the mountainous area.

### **Hizbul, separatists want to keep Valley on the boil**

With the death toll increasing to more than 60 in the troubled Kashmir in the past over two months, security forces, which are trying hard to restore the law and order, see the continuous cycle of violence as a brainchild of Hizbul Mujahideen and separatists, who want to keep the Valley on the boil.

Posters and leaflets published and distributed by the Hizbul Mujahideen in various areas of the Valley described a tale of coercion and intimidation, said sources in one of the counter-insurgency forces.

To keep the situation burning, innuendos and fabrication were being used to incite passions and instigate youths to see them take to the streets ostensibly to show that separatist's "agenda" still had the relevance.

### **Life returns to normal for two hours in Valley**

Life in various parts of the Kashmir valley returned to normal for two hours following a two-hour relaxation in the strike given by separatists from 5 p.m to 7 p.m yesterday.

People in large numbers came out for shopping and there was a heavy traffic. Public and private transport that remained off the road during the day also resumed and shops and other business establishments also opened.

The police had imposed restrictions in various parts of Srinagar city and other towns to thwart any protest marches by separatists.

Meanwhile, the police said the situation across the valley remained peaceful except a stray stone-throwing incident at Habba Kadal , Chota Bazar in Srinagar and Palhallan in Baramulla.

**Daring Taliban attack on Nato bases foiled**

Over two dozen Taliban militants — including suicide bombers — were killed on Saturday in a failed attempt to storm two US-run bases, including a nearby camp in eastern Afghanistan, where seven CIA employees were killed last year in a suicide bombing.

The alliance said that its troops had "repelled two failed attacks at bases in Khost", killing a total of 24 insurgents with the help of Afghan security forces. The attackers targeted US-run Forward Operating Bases (FOB) Salerno and Chapman, the International Security Assistance Force (ISAF), Nato's mission in Afghanistan, said in a statement.
