Fuel Price Hike: Call for Bharat Bandh on July 5

In a concerted effort by opposition parties to take on the government on the issue of fuel price hike, the BJP-led NDA and Left parties yesterday on Tuesday gave a call for a nationwide strike on July 5 demanding a rollback.

The NDA's call for a 12-hour "Bharat Bandh" came hours after the Left and non-BJP opposition parties called for a 12-hour nationwide strike on July 5 to protest the government's decision to increase the prices of petroleum products. All essential services like the supply of water, milk, electricity, hospital and emergency services would be exempt from the hartal.

Robbery at condolence meet: Cops reach after mourners looted despite alert

The Delhi police's claim to reach the crime spot within five minutes of a call to the PCR was proved wrong today when five armed men barged into a house in the Saraswati Vihar area and committed robbery even as the police failed to reach the spot despite being called by the victim in time.

According to victim businessman Om Prakash, his father had called the PCR when robbers were still in the house but the police called back after 15 minutes to know where Saraswati Vihar is located and reached after another 20 minutes when the robbers, after robbing around 15 women present in the house, had decamped with jewellery and cash worth lakhs of rupees.

The incident took place around 12.30 pm in house number D-820 of Saraswati Vihar, located about 2 km from Madhuban Chowk.

Nabbed Maoists eyed Sunderbans base

Nandigram Maoist unit chief Madhusudan Mondal alias Narayan alias Selim and his henchmen Siddhartha Mondal and Rajesh Mondal, who were arrested in the city on Tuesday, were setting up the Maoist network in coastal South 24-Parganas, including the Sunderbans. Three cellphones, a letter and some documents were recovered from them.

Narayan, who hails from Durgachak area of Haldia, has been involved with ultra-Left politics for two decades. He joined Sangrami Sramik Mancha as a youngster, and switched to the Naxalite organization Party Unit (PU) — the same outfit from where former Maoist state secretary Himadri Sen Roy alias Somen started his political career.

Narayan was one of the architects of Maoist expansion in the state, Sachin Ghoshal, 44, who hails from Bagnan in Howrah, was no less important in the Maoist network. He used to monitor the supply lines, apart from overseeing the party's intelligence wing.

Ammunition meant for Maoists seized in Kolkata

Over 5,000 rounds of .315 cartridges, possibly meant for the Maoists, were found in a car after it was intercepted by police for violating traffic rules near Shovabazar Metro Railway station here.

The discovery of the ammunition comes two days after a police constable belonging to the Howrah Police Lines was arrested in Burdwan town for supplying explosives to Maoists.

Earlier in 2003, 25,000 rounds of ammunition destined for militants in Kashmir and those operating in North East, were seized from an abandoned truck in the metropolis.

Upsurge in A(H1N1) cases in State

The Public Health authorities in the State are concerned at the upsurge in the number of A(H1N1) cases after a clear downswing in the initial months of 2010.

Twenty-one fresh cases of A(H1N1) infections were recorded in the last couple of months alone.

In May and June, 21 cases of A(H1N1) were confirmed, 2 in the first month and 19 in the next, according to health officials. This was after the lull of the first four months from January this year. Of these, 14 cases are in Kanyakumari, three are from Chennai, two from Tiruvallur, and one from Nagapattinam, Director of Public Health R.T. Porkaipandian informed.

400kg safe with jewellery stolen from shop in Pune

Within about 12 hours of the daring robbery at a jewellery shop on Laxmi Road, another shop was targeted at Market Yard, this time by burglars, despite round-the-clock police bandobast in the area.

The incident happened at Laxmi Jewellers in Ambedkarnagar in the wee hours of Tuesday. The shop's shutter locks were broken open to gain entry and a 400 kg safe containing gold and silver ornaments worth Rs 3.7 lakh was stolen.

A gang of armed men had entered Mahendra Jewellers on Laxmi Road around 3pm on Monday and looted jewellery worth about Rs 30 lakh from the shop after assaulting the owners. Two of the robbers were, however, nabbed by passersby while they were trying to flee.

Cops seize explosives in Munger

In a major haul of explosives, Bihar's Munger police on Tuesday seized 200 kgs of ammonium nitrate, 100 detonators and 400 gelatins from Shankarpur village under the Muffasil police station.

Police also recovered several live cartridges and a pistol, state DGP Neelmani said. Acting on a tip-off, a police team led by IPS probationer Shibdeep Lande raided the village and recovered the explosives, including seven bundles of fusewire, which were concealed in a place surrounded by hills.

Three youths killed in Anantnag escalating Tensions

Three youths were killed and five injured as police opened fire to break up a demonstration in Anantnag, Jammu and Kashmir on Tuesday. Many more were wounded in daylong clashes. The situation in north Kashmir remained tense, with most of the areas under curfew.

Reports from Anantnag said the three youths were killed when police fired at a crowd that was staging a protest against the death of five youths in north Kashmir in the past three days. The protesters were taking out a march when the police intercepted them. As news about the killings spread, thousands of people took to the streets. The police again opened fire, but this time in the air. More police and CRPF personnel have been deployed in south Kashmir.

Naxal Menace: 26 CRPF men killed in Chhattisgarh

Maoists on Tuesday shot dead 26 CRPF personnel and wounded eight others in an ambush in a remote area of Chhattisgarh's Narayanpur district in the latest of a series of deadly attacks by the ultra-Left activists.

A large number of heavily-armed Maoists, perched on a hilltop, opened fire from automatic weapons on a 63-member security contingent which was returning on foot from road opening duty.

The attack, which also left eight personnel, including four special police officers of Chhattisgarh Police injured, took place at Daurai Road area, about 300 km from here, around 3 pm.

Yesterday's attack came nearly three months after the worst massacre by the Maoists which left 75 personnel of the force and one Chhattisgarh policeman dead in Dantewada district on April six this year.
