Flash strike by container drivers, cleaners hits north Chennai

People in North Chennai were put to hardship, following a flash strike resorted by more than 300 drivers and cleaners on Wednesday evening protesting against inordinate delay in letting the export containers into the Chennai Port Trust.

Trouble began at Chennai Port Trust since Tuesday night as the Customs officials took nearly 10-12 minutes to clear a container against three minutes earlier. The slowdown was due to the cautious approach adopted by a Customs officer on Tuesday night. Till late evening, there was hardly any progress and lorries and trucks were seen lined-up till Ernavoor.

Some of the agitating lorry owners said that the issue could be solved once for all by erecting more gates on the lines of tollgates at zero gate and by deputing more officials to check the containers.

Rangaswamy claimed he had an account with ICICI Bank at Cantonment branch in Bangalore for past few years. In December last year when he opened his account, he was shocked to see Rs 2.50 lakh transferred to three accounts

2 held for fraud

The police has booked two Kharar residents on charges of misappropriating over Rs 50 lakh of an immigration company. According to the police, Rajiv Bajaj, who worked as an estate officer with Worldwide Immigration Consultancy Services, had complained that Deep Sharma, a resident of Sunny Enclave, and Gurpreet Singh Virk, a resident of Astha Enclave, who worked as accountant and treasury manager, respectively, used to allegedly make fake drafts and deposit only half of the amount received from clients. It was found that over 50 lakh had been allegedly misappropriated by them.

Shutdown imposed

A little-known group, Tehreek-i-Islami, imposed a shutdown in Srinagar and many other districts of the Valley on Wednesday.

The masked men belonging to the Tehreek-i-Islami held a press conference in downtown Srinagar criticising both Hurriyat factions.

“We have been taking on the might of India with stones and there has been no support from the resistance leaders,” a masked man told reporters at the house of 13-year-old Wamiq Ahmad, who was killed allegedly by a teargas shell fired by the police on Sunday.

The group called for a shutdown for four days to protest the boy’s death. Hundreds of youngsters came out onto the streets of Srinagar on Wednesday.

Widespread clashes in valley, 30 hurt

At least 30 persons, including 13 police and CRPF men, were injured in clashes between angry protesters and the police in several parts of the city for the third consecutive day yesterday. The police lobbed tear gas shells and fired in the air to disperse the demonstrators at various places across the city, while protests and clashes also took place in some other major towns, including Baramulla, Anantnag and Shopian, yesterday.

These protests have been held in protest against the death of teenage boy Wamiq Farooq. The Hurriyat Conference had called for a general strike against the increasing human rights violations, paralysing normal life across the valley on Tuesday.

Ultras planning to attack Vaishno Devi temple

Mata Vaishno Devi temple, that records the second highest number of pilgrims in the country, is facing a serious threat of a militant attack planned from across the border.

The CRPF is doing special patrolling in the surrounding mountains and forest areas for the past one week, besides stepping up vigil and security on the way to the shrine.

Eight Maoists shot dead in Chhattisgarh

Eight Maoist guerrillas were on Wednesday shot dead by the police in two gun-battles in Chhattisgarh's violence-hit Bastar region.

The gun fights broke out in thickly forested areas in Bijapur district, some 450 km south of state capital Raipur.

"Seven Maoists were killed in a forested stretch under Bhairamgarh police station when a contingent of District Force and Special Police Officers (SPOs) raided a hideout of rebels and exchanged fire for more than an hour. Another guerrilla was gunned down under Bijapur police station area," Superintendent of Police (Bijapur) Avinash Mohanty said over phone.

Police found some weapons and explosives at both the gun battle sites, police search teams were combing nearby areas to recover more bodies of guerrillas, if any.

Chhattisgarh's mineral-rich Bastar region, spread out over 40,000 sq km area and comprising five districts including Bijapur, is known as a nerve-centre of Maoist militancy in India where rebels have carried out a string of deadly attacks on police and civilians in recent years.

Bomb blast in northwest Pakistan; 8 killed including 4 foreigners

A bomb blast in northwest Pakistan killed eight people Wednesday, including four foreign aid workers and children at a school which had just been rebuilt after a previous Islamist attack.

Journalists were also wounded when the bomb exploded as Pakistani paramilitary forces escorted a group of foreign and local visitors to the inauguration ceremony for the newly built school in the volatile region.

Eight people were killed in this blast -- four foreigners, one security guard and three schoolgirls.
