Woman held for using fake credit card

A woman who allegedly tried to use a fake credit card to purchase gold jewellery in a shop in T. Nagar was detained by the Mambalam police on Tuesday.

According to police sources, J. Manjula (34) of Kundrathur selected a three-sovereign gold chain and offered to pay with her credit card. When the cashier asked for proof of identification, the woman said she did not have one on hand.

On swiping the card in the electronic data capturing machine, it became evident that Manjula was using a fake credit card. The shop staff alerted the Mambalam police who took custody of the woman. The accused told investigators that one Manoj had given her seven fake credit cards to purchase gold jewellery and give him a share.

32 killed in Iraq blast

Suicide bombers struck in quick succession on Wednesday in a former insurgent stronghold northeast of Baghdad, killing at least 32 people, just days before a crucial election that will determine who will govern the country as American forces depart.

The blasts in Baqouba, including one by a bomber who rode in an ambulance to a hospital and blew himself up there, were the deadliest in more than a month.

Magnitude 6.4 earthquake hits Taiwan

A 6.4 magnitude quake struck southern Taiwan on Thursday, with an epicentre 35 kilometres (22 miles) deep, the US Geological Survey said. No tsunami warning was immediately issued.

The quake, which hit about 70 kilometres from the main southern city of Kaohsiung, was felt as far away as the capital Taipei in the north of the island.

Taiwan is regularly hit by earthquakes as the island lies near the junction of two tectonic plates. A 7.6-magnitude quake killed around 2,400 people in September 1999.
