NDA, Left gear up for 'Bharat bandh' on Monday

The National Democratic Alliance (NDA), and the Left parties have issued separate calls for a 12-hour “Bharath Bandh” on Monday to protest the “hefty” increase effected in the prices of petroleum products by the United Progressive Alliance government.

While NDA working chairman and senior BJP leader L.K. Advani appealed to all sections and party workers to hold the agitation peacefully and make it a success to highlight the “insensitivity of the government,” the Communist Party of India (Marxist), the Communist Party of India, the All-India Forward Bloc and the Revolutionary Socialist Party called for a massive participation by the people in the bandh, saying that such a protest would send out a message to the government to review its policies, revoke the decontrol of fuel prices and drop any move for further decontrol.

Security stepped up for bandh today

Extensive security arrangements have been made across the Capital in view of bandh call for Monday given by the Opposition parties against the recent hike in oil prices by the Manmohan Singh Government. The police have appealed to the protesters not to take the law in their hands.

Apprehending that the protesters would attempt to block roads during the bandh, the traffic police have also made elaborate plans to deal with any such situation. Over 4,800 traffic policemen would man vehicular movement across the city. Joint Commissioner of Police (Traffic) Satyendra Garg said emphasis would be on keeping the highways and major roads absolutely clear of any blockade. “We will assess the situation and take necessary measures. Traffic diversions would be made accordingly.”

The Delhi committees of the CPI, CPI (M), RSP, AIFB, SP, JD(S), TDP, AIADMK, INLD and BJD have called for a separate bandh seeking roll back of the recent hike in the prices of diesel, petrol, kerosene and cooking gas. “With the wide support of students, teachers, workers, employees, traders and Delhi's citizens in general, the strike preparations are going on intensively to oppose the price rise,” said CPI office secretary Baban Kumar Singh, adding that activists and leaders of all these parties would take out processions and stage demonstrations at almost all major places, including ITO, in the Capital at 11:30 a.m.

Bomb scare at Metro stations

An anonymous caller threatened to blow up the Uttam Nagar and Rajiv Chowk Metro stations here on Sunday, triggering a scare. Security at these installations have been stepped up.

Shops, hotels, schools closed, taxis and autos off roads today

The city is expected to witness a near-total bandh on Monday with most shops and restaurants likely to down shutters and autos, taxis and fleet cabs deciding to stay off the roads. Educational institutes will also be shut with several schools asking parents to keep their children at home. Transporters have decided not to ferry vegetables, fruits and essential commodities to Mumbai. The state government is however making all efforts to foil the bandh through preventive arrests. By Sunday night, Mumbai police arrested over 1,100 people, while state police including Thane, Navi Mumbai and Raigad, detained over 14,000 potential troublemakers.

The state issued notices to around 9,000 potential troublemakers across the state. One Shiv Sena shakha pramukh and a few activists were arrested.

Accountant, auto drivers held for Rs 15L robbery

Two autorickshaw drivers and an accountant with a private sharebroking firm were arrested by the Juhu police on Saturday for assaulting and robbing a person of Rs 15 lakh.

The complainant, Kartik Parekh, worked in the same firm as one of the accused. On May 1, as Parekh was headed for office, two autos blocked his path, while the third accused stabbed him from behind and stole his bag containing Rs 15 lakh in cash.

Two servants decamp with 1.75cr loot, held

It took the Mumbai police less than 24 hours to nab two domestic helps who had robbed their employer's Malabar Hill residence of diamond jewellery, mobile and cash adding up to Rs 1.75 crore.

According to the police, the domestic helps, Maharaj and Raju, cleaned out diamond trader Aatish Nahar's flat in Tania Heights on Nepean Sea Road on Friday between 1pm and 4.30pm. The Nahars were sleeping when the two burgled the house. The family woke up to find their cupboards open and diamond jewellery, cash and mobile missing.

According to sources, the family had not listed either of the domestic helps with the local police. Following a spate of robberies and crimes involving domestic helps, the police had launched a campaign urging citizens to register their helps at the local police station to avoid any untoward incident.

Maoists call 48-hour 'Bharat bandh' from July 7

Maoists called for a 48-hour 'Bharat bandh' from July 7 to protest against the killing of their senior Politburo member Cherukuri Rajkumar alias Azad at Adilabad in Andhra Pradesh by the police, top Maoist leader Kishenji said on Sunday. Railways, milk, ambulance and fire

services have been exempted from the shutdown.

Kishenji claimed that Azad, the Maoist spokesman, was arrested from Nagpur along with another Maoist Sukdeb and taken 150 kms away to Adilabad where both were shot dead.

Tight bandobust for bandh

Break-in bid at ATM

Unidentified persons made a foiled attempt to steal cash from an ATM of State Bank of Patiala in Sector 21, Chandigarh, on Saturday night.

The incident came to light on Sunday morning when somebody noticed the damaged door of the place.

Inspector Ram Gopal said preliminary enquiry had revealed that somebody tried to enter the cubicle after forcefully entering an ATM card into the door, but he couldn't. He added that there was no security guard appointed at the ATM and the bank manager had lodged a complaint.

Morning stalkers strike again

After an interval of over two months unidentified motorcyclists armed with pistols again terrorised morning walkers. This time too it was women who turned out to be the assailants' targets.

In two separate incidents the armed assailants robbed two women at gunpoint during the early morning hours in Khuda Ali Sher village here on Friday. In another incident that occurred on Thursday night two unidentified motorcyclists robbed two sisters of their jewellery near Punjab Engineering College.

These incidents are a shocking reminder of a spate of four incidents of women robbed at gunpoint by unidentified motorcyclists in the city on April 19. The police has not yet been able to track down the miscreants.

Curfew back in Anantnag

The authorities had to reimpose curfew in the Anantnag town of south Kashmir after a group of youths took to streets and resorted to stone pelting and clashed with police and security forces. The district administration had relaxed the curfew for two hours in the morning, but after the youth resorted to stone pelting, it had to reimpose the curfew in the town.

In most parts of north Kashmir, including Baramulla, Sopore, Kulgam and various parts of Srinagar city, curfew was completely lifted, though in Sopore, night curfew would remain in force till further orders.

Government-run ration depots in these areas opened this morning and long queues were seen outside them. Shops in uptown Srinagar also opened and traffic plied on all routes.

However, in Anantnag, when the curfew was relaxed in the morning for two hours, people took to streets at various places and attacked the Deputy Commissioner's office, two police stations and threw stones at security forces, prompting reimposition of curfew.

New York airport terminal evacuated after bomb scare

Officials at New York's John F. Kennedy International Airport evacuated one of its airport terminals after a bomb scare Sunday on one of the busiest US holiday travel days, WABC television reported.

The television station reported that authorities cleared JFK's Terminal 1, while hazardous materials experts and other emergency crews arrived at the scene.

But the network, an affiliate of CNN, reported that it expected shortly to receive an "all-clear" from security officials meaning that there authorities believe there is no imminent threat.
