### IM declared terror outfit

The government has declared the Indian Mujahideen (IM), suspected to be a shadow outfit of the banned Students Islamic Movement of India (SIMI) and Pakistan-based Lashkar-e-Taiba, a terrorist outfit.

The IM is allegedly involved in the serial bomb blasts in Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Bangalore and Mumbai. It has been added to the list of terror groups under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967.

The IM came to light after the February 23, 2005 blast in Varanasi. Its hand was suspected in the incident. In 2008, it was allegedly involved in many terror attacks.

Intelligence agencies believe that the outfit is also a front group of the Harkat-ul-Jihad-al-Islami (HuJI).

### Two arrested for 100 cases of snatching

Two members of the infamous Trichy gang were arrested by the south district police on Thursday. Gang leader Mohan alias Maggu is one of them. A case of theft had been filed against Mohan (35) and his accomplice, Kumresh (34), in the Safdarjung Enclave police station.

The gang has been operating in Delhi and NCR since 2004, and is involved in over 100 cases of snatchings. Several stolen articles including two laptops and three mobile phones have been recovered from their possession. The gang usually targeted parked vehicles and broke the glass open to steal and flee with the valuables. Another regular technique was to spread currency notes near the car to divert driver's attention.

### Indian Mujahideen mastered the art of hacking WiFi

The Indian Mujahideen (IM) had a signature-style modus operandi. It warned just minutes before it struck. The gang had a media cell.

Its job was to send emails to the media claiming responsibility of the blast, just minutes before the explosives went off.

Mansoor Peerbhoy and Salmaan Kadar Shaikh, both software experts, were in charge of the media cell. The duo, along with seven others, enrolled for a course in Hyderabad in May

2007.

It taught them to hack unsecured WiFi connections. Peerbhoy contacted several computer experts , seeking their views on hacking. Several of them unknowingly gave him tips on how to send emails that can't be traced.

The outfit had set up a full-fledged control room at the Ashoka Mews building in Pune. After the blasts, the members used to watch news channels to know about the police progress in investigations.

Bike-borne goons snatched cash and cellphones at gunpoint from a couple in Santiniketan's Sonajhuri forest on Thursday morning.

When the goons whisked out a gun and asked the couple to hand over their belongings, the latter did so as they got scared. But they mustered courage and followed the goons on a motorcycle. Soon, others joined them in the chase.

Finally, one of the goons was spotted behind Natya Ghar on the Visva-Bharati campus and caught. Apart from the gun, cops recovered mobiles and cash from the arrested goon.

#### **Woman hurt in flower market blast dies**

A 60-year-old woman, who had received splinter injuries in a blast at the Mallickghat wholesale flower market on Thursday night, died at Medical College & Hospital, Kolkata, on Friday afternoon. Along with her, nine others were injured in the blast.

The crude bomb had been kept in a sealed container. It was found near a garbage dump by 11-year-old Biky Shaw, who brought it to the market as a plaything. However, many in the market were interested in finding out its contents. Dukhiram Mondal, who runs a snacks outlet, tried to pry open the container. As they forced open the lid, the container suddenly exploded, injuring all of them

A man posing as a policeman in civil clothes robbed a 63-year woman of her gold jewellery in Royapettah on Thursday evening.

The incident occurred on Thursday evening when Padmavathi of V.N. Das Road in Border Thottam returned from Manali, where she had gone to inspect a plot that she had bought recently.

She got down from an MTC bus near the Royapettah clock tower and was walking towards Pycrofts Lane when a man in a safari suit intercepted her and told her there was unrest in the neighbourhood. He advised her to remove her jewellery and keep them safely in her handkerchief.

He asked her to get into an autorickshaw parked nearby and remove the jewellery. The suspect also helped her in keeping the jewellery in the handkerchief.

But after reaching home, the victim realised that her jewellery weighing four sovereigns was missing and the handkerchief only had stones.

### Cops foil plan to loot, three held

Continuing its campaign against anti-social elements, the Patna police on Friday foiled a plan to loot a city trader by arresting three gangsters from the riverine belt of the Ganga in north Dujra.

SSP Amit Kumar Jain said the arrested criminals have been identified as Ajay Kumar alias Budhwa, Chintu Kumar and Sanjit Prasad, all residents of Dujra Devisthaan under Buddha Colony police station. He said that Ajay and Chintu were earlier sent to jail in connection with cases of serious offences.

Jain said Ajay confessed that he along with his four associates were planning to loot Rs 25 lakh cash from a Lodipur-based trader when the cash would be deposited in Punjan National Bank, Boring Road branch. He told the police that one Shashi had acted as the informant and was also promised his share.

### **One arrested with FICN worth Rs 1 lakh**

The Anti Terrorist Squad (ATS) of the Uttar Pradesh Police (UPP) on Friday arrested one Kanhaiya Lal Gupta in Siddhart Nagar district of UP on Nepal border after Rs 1 lakh of Fake Indian Currency Note (FICN) was recovered from his possession. Initial investigations have revealed that Gupta was actively working for the Pakistani agency, the Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI) and looking after the FICN segment through UP-Nepal border and had pumped in no less than Rs 1 crore in FICN during the last 5 years.

### Two held for theft

The police arrested two persons who had decamped with stolen laptops, LCDs and Rs 30 lakh cash after breaking the locks of a showroom in Sector 9 on November 20.

Those arrested have been identified as Satish Kumar, alias Sandeep (Fouji), a resident of Uttar Pradesh, and Arjun Lal, a resident of Hoshiarpur, Punjab.

The court has already sent Arjun Lal to police custody while Satish Kumar was produced in the court yesterday, which remanded him in police custody till June 10.

The two accused had stolen 61 laptops, 36 LCDs and Rs 30 lakh in cash after breaking the locks of the shutters of SCO No. 332, Sector 9, last year during the night of November 20.

#### **War may break out any moment: North Korea envoy**

A North Korean envoy warned on Thursday that war could erupt at any time on the divided Korean peninsula because of tension with Seoul over the sinking of a South Korean warship in March.

"The present situation of the Korean peninsula is so grave that a war may break out any moment," Ri Jang Gon, North Korea's deputy ambassador in Geneva, told the United Nations-sponsored Conference on Disarmament. South Korea has accused North Korea of firing a torpedo at the vessel and has vowed to bring the case to the UN Security Council.
