ISI-backed bombing plot by Khalistan group foiled

Security agencies have unearthed yet another ISI-scripted terror plot with the arrest of Khalistan Commando Force (KCF) terrorist Nirmal Singh alias Nimma, who was tasked to attack Adampur Air Force station in Punjab and recruit locals from villages along Indo-Pakistan border to set up a terror network.

Nimma was arrested from Raipur district in Chhattisgarh on Sunday. The KCF terrorist, who was holed up abroad returned to India via Greece following instructions from his bosses in Germany and Pakistan to stage some "action". He was seen in Punjab but disappeared after a terror cell of Babbar Khalsa was busted.

Nimma was also tasked to attack the congregation of Dera Sacha Sauda, in what could have inevitably set off clashes between followers of Baba Ram Rahim and those who are incensed by his claim to be a legatee of gurus.

LeT has been itching to target foreigners and multinational establishments in India as part of its plan to project India as an "unsafe" destination ahead of Commonwealth Games. Arrest of the KCF terrorist coincided with busting of three modules of LeT last week.

Lashkar had activated its three modules — including one in Nepal — to carry out deadly terror attacks in markets in Delhi, the multinational auditing firm Deloitte in Hyderabad and other cities to create havoc in India's mainland during the last weekend.

Snatchers shoot chasing man

Two bikers, fleeing after snatching a gold chain from a woman in Vaishali, yesterday shot at two property dealers chasing them. One of the realtors died, while the other is fighting for his life in the Paras Hospital at Vaishali.

The injured property dealer told the police that they were chasing the snatchers when they were shot at from a close range. Raghuvir Lal, SSP, however, said it appeared to be a case of enmity.

Both the realtors were shot at from a close range and both of them were wounded between the chest and stomach.

Gang of robbers busted in S Delhi, eight arrested

Eight criminals were arrested by south district police for their involvement in robberies and dacoities, said police.

Six of the accused are Bangladeshis, including Ikramul Haq (37) who is allegedly involved in more than 200 cases of robberies and dacoities.

With their arrest, jewellery worth several lakhs, a pistol, five vehicles and a motorcycle were seized. They were arrested from Vasant Kunj on April 30 on a tip-off when they came to the locality to commit a dacoity in the farmhouse of a businessman.

Modus Operandi: They used to break into homes, overpower inmates by flashing weapons and lock them up in a room. Then they used to escape with the cash and other valuables.

Mumbai motormen back on track: Call off day-old strike after assurance on salary hike

Over a thousand motormen on Mumbai's Western and Central railway suburban lines who went on strike from Monday morning to press for their demands for higher wages and better working conditions began returning to work this evening after receiving an assurance from the Maharashtra government.

The strike was called off but not before a day full of drama that witnessed imposition of the Essential Services Maintenance Act (ESMA), dismissal of 10 motormen and the arrest of another 170 of them.

While the train services resumed by late yesterday evening after the scheduling formalities were over, normal service is expected only by today morning.

More commuting blues for Mumbai, Meru cab drivers go on strike

Adding up to the troubles of commuters being faced in view of ongoing stir by motormen, Meru cab drivers yesterday went on strike to press for their demands for rise in pay scales and unfair suspension of drivers.

About 1,700 odd cabs belonging to private taxi service Meru, have decided to not ply as a part of the protest.

Meru taxi drivers said that they were protesting due to low payments, unfair suspension of drivers by the management and ill-treatment meted to them by management.

Posing as Crime Branch officer, businessman stole cars

Bangalore police have arrested Mahesh Gowda, a 22-year-old wholesaler of readymade garments, for stealing expensive cars by posing as a cop from the Crime Branch.

Gowda ran his syndicate with the help of his friends Riyan and Nayaz, who were also in the garment business.

The group stole two Innova cars from areas that fall under the jurisdiction of Sanjay Nagar and Ashok Nagar police station respectively.

Gowda, a resident of Bharat Nagar, wasn't doing well in his business. Hence, in a bid to make a quick buck, he decided to dupe people by posing as a cop.

Modus operandi: Gowda got himself a police uniform and a fake identity card. He, along with his accomplice, used to stop drivers and assert that they had violated traffic rules.

Then, they would scare them by claiming to be from the Central Crime Branch and take them to an isolated place. There they would ask the driver to get down and then run away with the car.

Lashkar planned to attack Hyderabad HITEC City

Pakistan-based Lashkar-e-Toiba (LeT) was planning bomb attacks on the HITEC City, a major IT township in Hyderabad, and the office of a multinational auditing firm.

Mohammad Zia Ul Haq, who was arrested yesterday following a tip off by the National Investigation Agency, was directed by his LeT handlers to bomb the Hyderabad office of Deloitte Touche Tohmatsu, one of the four largest auditors in the world, and was in the process of carrying out the plan.

Besides, Haq had been tasked to carry out terror attack at the Hyderabad Information Technology Engineering Consultancy City (HITEC City), spread over 151 acres and at the centre of the information technology industry in Hyderabad. He has already procured the explosives supplied by the LeT to carry out the attack.

Rs.10 lakh stolen from rice mill clerk

Unnown persons snatched a cash bag containing Rs.10 lakh from the clerk of a rice mill outside the State Bank of India at Pidiguralla in Guntur district on Tuesday. Madhav, who is a 5 per cent partner of Kanchanaganga Rice Mill in Piduguralla town, withdrew Rs.10 lakh for making payments related to the business.

Grenade attack on CRPF picket, pedestrian hurt

A pedestrian was injured in a grenade explosion in the busy market place, Hari Singh High Street, here yesterday afternoon, breaking a long spell of relative calm in the capital city ahead of the reopening of Darbar Move offices here next week.

The police here said militants hurled a grenade towards a CRPF picket around 2.15 pm and Ghulam Qadir Dar of the Mehjoor Nagar locality was injured in the blast. The explosion led to disturbance in the busy market as the pedestrians ran helter-skelter for their lives. Several others were also injured in the melee.

Sopore continues to be tense:

Meanwhile, even as mystery shrouds the killing of a top militant in Sopore, the situation in the town continued to be tense for the third consecutive day yesterday.

Basharat Saleem, one of the most wanted militants, who was a divisional commander of the Harkat-ul-Mujahideen (HuM) and had been active in the area for the past four years was killed a few days ago.

While the police claims that Saleem was killed in a clash between HuM and Lashkar-e-Toiba (LeT) militants, his family alleges he was killed in an encounter with the Army in the Machil sector on the LoC in Kupwara.

Markets, schools and colleges remained closed in Sopore for the third day today in protest against the killing of the militant. At certain places, youths pelted security forces with stones.

Pakistan-born man held for Times Square bomb

Faisal Shahzad, a Pakistan-born citizen of the United States, was arrested on Monday night in connection with the Times Square bomb incident, even as he tried to board a flight from New York's John F. Kennedy International Airport to Dubai.

At approximately 11:45 P.M. EDT, Faisal Shahzad was taken into custody. Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and detectives of the New York City Police Department arrested Shahzad for allegedly driving a car bomb into Times Square on the evening of May 1, 2010.

Mr. Shahzad, who is a naturalised U.S. citizen, was stopped from boarding the flight after he

was identified by the Department of Homeland Security's Customs and Border Protection.

Volcanic ash prompts Ireland to close its airports

Ireland's Aviation Authority said on Monday it was banning all flights in and out of Ireland on Tuesday morning because of a renewed risk of volcanic ash drifting south from Iceland.

All flights to and from Irish airports will be banned from 7am to 1pm local time Tuesday (0600GMT to 1200GMT; 2am to 8am EDT), the authority said in a statement. The restrictions will not affect planes flying over Ireland from Britain and Europe.
