Six youths arrested for robbing people

Six youths were arrested for their alleged involvement in robbing people on the pretext of giving them lift in their vehicle and recovered several stolen articles, including 30 mobile phones.

The arrested, in the age group of 18 to 21 years, were caught from near Alakananda in south-east Delhi and Jahapanah forest area yesterday. Police recovered 30 mobile phones, six fake number plates, two credit cards, two kirpans, a country-made pistol, and a car from their possession.

Defence college on LeT target

Two leading boarding schools and a few five-star hotels located at popular tourist destinations are on the target of Pakistan-based terror organisation Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT), a senior Home Ministry official said here yesterday.

According to intelligence inputs filtering in from the USA, the organisation plans to attack National Defence College located near South Block. The college runs courses on Indian and international strategic and warfare issues. At present, around 25 foreign officers are undertaking courses here.

The news comes in the wake of reports that David Coleman Headley and Tahawwur Hussain Rana, arrested by the FBI for plotting a major terror attack in India at the behest of the LeT, had revealed that they were planning to attack National Defence College in New Delhi.

Police gear up to discipline traffic

Don't be surprised if you are stopped by uniformed policemen not belonging to the traffic branch of the city police if you break a signal in South Mumbai. The Mumbai police has started a campaign to specially target habitual offenders who manage to give the traffic police the slip. Special teams of local police personnel are being deployed at important junctions and signals to keep a lookout for such drivers.

The campaign, the brainchild of additional commissioner of police RK Padmanabhan, is called nakabandi points. It has been kicked off in South Mumbai as a pilot project and involves 80 policemen stationed at 16 crucial traffic signals between Nariman Point and Mahalaxmi.

Maoists plan big hit

Police suspect that a major attack by the Maoists is on the cards with a platoon of the People's Liberation Guerrilla Army reaching the Andhra-Orissa Border from Dandakaranya and joining another platoon already stationed there.

There are around 70 armed Maoists in the new platoon and sleuths feel they may be planning a big attack like the one on the Nalco bauxite mine.

“The threat is more to Orissa than for us but we are on high alert,” said the Vizianagaram superintendent of police, Mr Y. Gangadhar. “We have information that a platoon has moved to the area and is planning a major attack.”

In April, around 200 naxals attacked Nalco Bauxite mine in Orissa's Koraput district. It took a nine-hour gun battle to secure the mine and eight Central Industrial Security Force personnel and four Maoists were killed in the operation. Maoists raided the mine to loot weapons.

Fake notes found in SBI Gondia, Maharashtra

Nine fake notes totalling Rs 3,300 were reportedly found in the local branch of State Bank of India recently. Sources said that there was a huge rush on the counters of State Bank of India on October 18, 2009, during which some suspicious notes were accepted erroneously by the counter staff.

These included six notes of Rs 500 denomination and three notes of Rs 100 each. The notes were sent for the verification to the Reserve Bank of India, which found the notes to be fake. The matter was then reported to the crime branch of Gondia police, which is investigating in the case.

Quake injures 700 in southern Iran

An earthquake struck a key port city in southern Iran early on Wednesday, injuring at least 700 people and cutting power and telephone lines, the state news agency reported.

IRNA said 100 of the injured had been hospitalised while the rest were minor cases.

The 4.9-magnitude quake struck Bandar Abbas at 2:56 am local time, sending residents streaming into the streets. Bandar Abbas is home to a large oil refinery that primarily serves the domestic market.

The broadcast said there were no reports of deaths in the quake, which hit 1,367 kilometres south of the capital.

Iran is located on seismic fault lines and is prone to earthquakes. It experiences at least one slight earthquake everyday on average.

Suspected US missile strike in Pakistan kills two

A suspected US drone aircraft fired two missiles on Thursday into North Waziristan, a major al-Qaida and Taliban sanctuary in northwest Pakistan, killing two people, Pakistani intelligence officials said.

The United States has launched 44 such strikes on suspected militants in Pakistan this year compared with 32 last year.

Pakistani forces launched an offensive against militants in the neighbouring South Waziristan region on the Afghan border in mid-October.

The strike hit a house in a village about 18 km (12 miles) east of North Waziristan's main town of Miranshah.
