He found that all the locks of the ground and first floors were broken.

The tenants returned around 7 pm to find the house ransacked. The locks of all the almiras were broken.

A gang that prepared duplicate season passes for suburban train travel was busted by the CST GRP on Sunday. The three accused are in their mid-twenties and are well-versed in computers.

Ticket examiner Ranbir Singh Hooda was checking season passes. He found that a pass was fake. The pass holder, K D'Costa, was questioned and handed over to us. D'Costa, a Kalyan resident, would prepare the fakes on the computer. His two friends, Hitesh Khanna and Craig Paul, helped with printouts.

A computer has been seized from the trio. They have been charged with cheating under the Indian Penal Code.

CCTV grabs give away laptop thief at airport

The CCTV camera acted spy at Mumbai airport on Monday and landed a passenger in cops' net after he stole another flier's laptop.

The accused, 50-year-old Jayant Roy, had almost managed to escape with the loot as he flew out of Mumbai by a Kingfisher Mumbai-Patna-Ranchi flight. But his game was up as he waited in transit at Patna.

Around 10 am, an Air India passenger, Shashank Gang, who was on his way to Jodhpur, forgot to collect his laptop after he put it on X-ray for security check at terminal 1A. However, soon after, he realised his mistake and returned to fetch it but could not find it anywhere. Running late, Gang asked one of his relatives to follow up the matter with CISF officials; his nephew lodged a complaint with the security officials.

As the officials went through the CCTV footage of the security hold area, they spotted Roy walking away with two laptops, when he should have been carrying only one as his cabin baggage.

The association was protesting against the alleged inaction by the Punjab Police against the accused responsible for the death of an advocate in a road accident on January 26.

Hizbul militant killed in Pulwama

A Hizbul Mujahideen militant was killed and another injured when militants late last night attacked the house of a senior Congress leader in Rohama village in Pulwama district. According to information, the militants came to the house of Abdul Gani Dar, district Congress president, at Rohama village.

On being challenged by Mushtaq Ahmed, Personal Security Officer(PSO) of the leader, the militants opened fire. The PSO returned the fire, killing one of the militants, Aslam Kalas, alias Janbaz of the Hizbul Mujahideen, and injuring another. Later, the injured militant was arrested by the police and admitted to hospital here.

20 hurt during refugee front's protest

Twenty members of the J&K PoK Refugee Front were injured when the police resorted to a lathi-charge to thwart their attempt to gherao the Civil Secretariat complex here yesterday. The protesters were demanding a rehabilitation policy for the refugees of Pakistan occupied Kashmir (PoK).

As soon as they reached near Shalamar Chowk, the police tried to stop them. When the agitators did not disperse, the cops cane-charged them and used water cannons to disperse them.

At least 20-25 tear gas shells were lobbed, which not only left some of the protesters injured, but also caused injuries to some shopkeepers and cops.

The protesters raised anti-government and anti-Chief Minister slogans and threatened the government with dire consequences, if their demands were not accepted soon.

Finally, the police foiled the protesters' attempt to gherao the assembly. A few of them were also rounded up and released later.

Three zehar khurans held, Allahabad

The Government Railway Police, On Monday, claimed to have busted an inter-district gang of zehar khurans and arrested three of its members near Phaphamau railway station.

The arrested zehar khurans were identified as Deepak Kuamr Vishwakarma of Nawabganj, Raghuraj P Singh of Ghazipur and Deepak Kumar of Chandauli.

The police also seized 300 banned tablets and stolen articles from their possession.

GRP officials said the trio had committed over three dozen cases of drugging and robbing on Delhi-Kanpur and Allahabad-Lucknow routes. GRP were now hunting for Shree Patel, the alleged mastermind of the gang.

Officials also pointed out that the arrested zehar khurans were expert in depriving valuables from passengers and they used to offer soft drinks laced with poisonous substances to gullible passengers.

Reds blow up NGO-run school in Palamu

Maoists blew up a school at Chapee under Panki police station in Palamu district late on Sunday evening. The Maoists had damaged to the same school in last year as well.

The school has been targetted by the rebels as it is often used to house security forces. The latest attack on the school by Maoists is apparently to ensure that security forces deployed for Operation Green Hunt do not use it as a camp yet again. The school is run by an NGO — Alternative For India Development (AID).

Palamu SP A T Mathew said the Maoists came at night and blew up the school. He also said the ongoing crackdown on maoists in the district would continue.

Chapee is a known Maoist citadel and there is hardly any household there without Maoist influence.

Suicide attacks on U.S. mission in Peshawar, Awami party rally

Suicide bombers struck at the U.S. Consulate-General in Peshawar yesterday on Monday afternoon in an attempt to breach the premises.

Two Pakistani guards and four terrorists were killed in the attack and no American casualties were reported.

The Tehrik-i-Taliban (TTP-Pakistan wing of the Taliban) has claimed responsibility for the attack, which is being billed by security analysts as similar to the terror strike at the General Headquarters of the Army in Rawalpindi in October last.

Hours earlier, in a suicide bomb strike at an Awami National Party rally in the Lower Dir district of North West Frontier Province (NWFP) over 40 persons were killed. The rally was organised to celebrate the renaming of the NWFP as Khyber-Pukhtoonkhwa.

Nine hijacked vessels traced to Mogadishu

Nine hijacked vessels, carrying 95 Indians, have been traced to Mogadishu off Somalia and efforts are being made to secure their release. Somali pirates, who seized 11 dhows, have released two boats with 26 Indians on board and the government believes the hostages are safe.
