### **Rs 4 lakh stolen from car parked outside bank**

A resident of Mayur Vihar was shocked to find that his bag containing Rs 4 lakh was stolen from his car parked outside a bank here. The incident took place on Monday.

The victim had gone to deposit his cheque in the bank when the incident took place. The car driver was in the car when the theft took place.

The victim Amit Kansal, who deals in steel trade and has a shop in Ghaziabad, had come to deposit a cheque at Nainital Bank in Sector-2. His driver Mahendra Singh parked the car outside the bank. He was in the car when the bag containing Rs 4 lakh which was kept on its back seat was stolen, Mahindra told the police that someone had knocked at the back of the car. When he went to see, the person escaped with the bag in a flash of moment. He raised an alarm but of no avail.

While in another incident some bike-borne men snatched the purse of a woman, a resident of Sector-61.

The purse contained her ATM card, Rs 8,000 and some important documents. Her husband Prashant Kumar has lodged an FIR at Sector-58 police station. Till late evening the police was clueless about the snatchers.

#### **Fire breaks out in heritage building in Mumbai**

A fire broke out in a commercial building at Fort area in south Mumbai here today, fire brigade officials said.

The flames broke out on the ground floor of Ready Money Mansion building at about 12.30am, the eight fire engines and six water tankers were rushed to the spot to carry out operation. It took more than two hours to douse the fire, they said.

The five-storied heritage building consisted of several offices. The incident occurred after midnight, when all the offices were closed, they said, adding no casualties were reported.

Though the exact reason for fire is not yet known, officials suspect that a short circuit might have caused it.

#### **MBA held for producing fake certificate to get US visa**

An MBA graduate was arrested on Monday for producing a fake IT experience certificate at the US Consulate here to get a visa.

The police said B Prashanth of Andhra Pradesh after getting the certificate, for Rs 4,000 in Hyderabad from a man called Satish Reddy, was called for an interview here on Monday. During the interview, he gave doubtful information about his work experience. When interrogated further, he confessed that he had completed his MBA and obtained the fake certificate through his friend.

Prashanth said he had not found any job in Andhra and planned to fly to the US in search of employment. As advised by a travel agent, he included a fake experience certificate and enclosed it with his application.

Based on the complaint of consulate officials, Prashanth was arrested and remanded in judicial custody on Tuesday after being produced before a magistrate court. Further investigations are on.

### Stir hits train services in state

A day after the road users faced severe hardships due to the bandh in non-Telangana regions, it was the turn of the rail passengers to taste the ire of the protesters on Tuesday.

Police watched on even as the agitators of Samaikhya Andhra movement went on stopping

one train after another till late afternoon at several stations in the state.

In all, 92 trains were stopped by the agitators for durations ranging from 10 minutes to five hours (the average detention worked out to 66 minutes per train). Most of the trains in Vijayawada, Guntur, Hubli, Secunderabad and Waltair divisions were running late by at least 45 mins-1 hour, putting the passengers to a lot of inconvenience.

Many trains that were not stopped by the agitators were also hit due to the delayed running of the trains that were halted. The railway authorities cancelled more than 35 trains due to the rail roko across the state.

The maximum detentions took place near Vikarabad in Ranga Reddy district and in Karimnagar district between Kazipet and Ramagundam.

#### **3 booked for duping man of Rs 3 lakh**

Unidentified people allegedly duped a software professional to the tune of Rs 3 lakh by stealing the password of his net banking account between August 21 and 26, 2009.

Following a complaint by Shriniwas Devtha (32) of Shantiban society, Kothrud, the police have booked three suspects, identified as Bharat Vyas, Rohit Saxena and Samor Virani, all from Mumbai.

According to inspector Vilas Narnavar, Devtha was using net banking facility of a private bank for the last few years. On August 26, he came to know that some unidentified persons had withdrawn Rs 3 lakh from his account.

Investigations revealed that the amount had been transferred to three accounts with the same bank in Mumbai.

**Bus strike affects normal life in State**

An indefinite strike by private bus operators demanding revision of fares and students' concession and a day's token strike by a section of the Kerala State Road Transport Corporation (KSRTC) staff demanding the release of DA at a rate higher than that agreed to by the government affected normal life in the State on Tuesday.

While places fully dependent on private bus services were badly affected, areas served by the KSRTC were able to manage, though with much difficulty.

The impact of the strike was minimal in the capital city as members of the pro-CITU union of the KSRTC dissociated from the strike and operated services. A section of the private operators also chose to ply their vehicles here. But passengers had to wait longer, as the services were infrequent, and had to squeeze in as the buses were overcrowded.

The situation was entirely different in others parts of the State. Kochi and Kozhikode cities were virtually paralysed.
