Woman promised job, raped in car

A job agent raped a 24-year-old married woman in his car after he took her to a desolate area in south Delhi on the pretext of providing her a job in a hospital reportedly owned by his uncle.

The victim told the police that the accused identified as Mohit, 30, raped her in his car in the desolate area of Vasant Kunj on Tuesday. She said he had promised her a job of a nurse in the hospital owned by his uncle in Khanpur.

He then asked her to come in his car to the hospital for the interview. The victim agreed to go with Mohit for the interview. Mohit took her half way to the hospital and then parked the car at a desolate place. He then raped her in the car.

Mohit then threatened her of dire consequences if she told anyone. The victim told her husband four days later.

Husband, wife nabbed for cheating banks

A married couple has been arrested at Saraswati Vihar here for alleged involvement in a conspiracy to cheat banks by obtaining loans on the basis of forged property documents.

On October 31, the police received a call from the Pitampura branch of Nainital Bank alleging that a woman had been caught trying to withdraw Rs.5 lakh, part of a loan amount obtained through fraudulent means.

Advisory: Symptoms

Headache, fever, exhaustion, severe joint and muscle pain, pain in moving eyes and low backache. Temperature rises quickly and a rash may come on the face and then disappear. The glands in the neck are often swollen

Prevention

Spray DDT or flit, prevent stagnation of water, cover doors and windows with mesh and screens and apply a mosquito repellent cream on the exposed parts of the body. There must be proper drainage for dirty water.

Cheat cheques out with cash

Next week a Mumbai police team will go to Dharwad in Karnataka to investigate a fraud allegedly committed by a person called B Rehmatali. He reportedly stole a cheque leaflet belonging to the MD of a reputed firm and then transferred Rs 19 lakh to his own account at Dharwad.

According to the Pant Nagar police, the matter came to light when Armugham Mahendran checked his ICICI saving account at the Ghatkopar branch on October 23. Mahendran found that the money had been transferred on October 16 to the account of one Rehmatali, holding an account with bank's Dharwad branch.

Investigators checked Rehmatali's bank account status and it showed zero balance. The person could have used a fake name and documents to open the bank account especially to clear the stolen cheque.

Mahendran brought the matter to the notice of his legal advisor Balchandra Virkar, who conducted a check with the branches at Ghatkopar and Dharwad and found that the fraudster removed the entire sum within a week from different locations in Karnataka.

Medicos to intensify agitation

With no assurances from State government to enhance stipends, the ongoing agitation of medicos in government teaching hospitals is likely to be intensified further.

On Thursday, the junior doctors continued to boycott Arogyasri-related duties at all teaching hospitals even as the authorities maintained silence on the issue.

The demand for enhancement of stipend by junior doctors could snowball into a major controversy and even disrupt medical facilities at government hospitals if authorities did not take proactive measures and contain the issue. The medicos said that a State-level meeting of junior doctors would be held on Friday to chalk out a strategy to intensify their agitation.

Dengue cases in city touch 18

With three positive cases of dengue being reported in the past 72 hours at the GMCH, Sector 32, the total number of people infected with the disease in the city has gone up to 18.

UT nodal officer of integrated disease surveillance programme HC Gera said all patients had been suffering from fever for the past four days. They were detected with dengue when their blood samples tested positive. Earlier, the UT health department had registered 15 cases of dengue in October.

33 militants killed in Waziristan by Army and US drones

Renewed pitched battles erupted around the Taliban stronghold of Sararogha with 28 militants and five soldiers killed in fresh clashes, as US drones, after a brief lull fired missiles targeting a hideout in North Waziristan killing five other insurgents.

Pakistani forces advancing along three fronts on Taliban hubs also faced heavy fire fight as Taliban fighters held them back from overrunning their other key stronghold of Ladha in South Waziristan.

Heavy street fighting is reported going on in the town over the past 24 hours. Pakistani forces claimed they had captured the Ladha fort.

Fresh fighting was again reported from Sararogha which the Army claimed to have captured on Tuesday and the five Army soldiers, including an officer were killed in a blast in the town, which was a former operational base of slain Taliban warlord Baitullah Mehsud.
