Petrol pumps strike on April 9

The Federation of All-India Petroleum Traders has announced a complete shutdown of all petrol pumps in the Capital on April 9 in protest against the Delhi Government's decision to hike VAT on diesel from 12.5 per cent to 20 per cent, which it termed as the highest in the country.

In a statement, Federation general secretary Ajay Bansal said nearly 400 petrol pumps affiliated to it would observe a complete shutdown.

DGP to rattled ranks: Brace for the worst

Brace for the worst and shoot if you are shot at, Bengal DGP Bhupinder Singh told his men after the Dantewada massacre on Tuesday.

The Maoist brutality in Chhattisgarh sent shockwaves through the Bengal police ranks, more so after reports came in that a group of heavily armed Maoists had entered Purulia from neighbouring states. All camps and police stations on the border and in the Maoist-affected districts of Purulia, Bankura and West Midnapore have been put on maximum alert.

Considering the gruesome nature of the Chhattisgarh ambush, the administration went all out to ensure forces deployed in anti-Maoist operations in Bengal were not rattled. "The incident does not increase the threat our forces have been facing. Our security personnel have been working in difficult situations and they have been under such threats and danger for years," chief secretary Asok Mohan Chakrabarti said.

A security review meeting was held in Chennai on Tuesday in the backdrop of the recce done by David Coleman Headley on civilian and Armed Forces establishments with specific reference to the threat perception to Defence Services Staff College (DSSC), Wellington.

Mock hijack drill conducted

A mock hijack was conducted at the Chennai airport on Tuesday to check the efficacy of contingency plan to handle such situations and to check the preparedness of various agencies involved during such emergencies.

Under the programme an Air India flight acted as an 'affected airline'. While it was flying on an international sector it was hijacked and diverted to Chennai.

When the aircraft landed at the Chennai airport with pilot, crew and the passengers including the hijackers, it was positioned on a designated isolated parking stand. Anti-hijacking control room was activated.

Negotiations with the hijackers were simulated by Suburban Police and at that time a few hostages were released by the hijackers. They were taken to emergency medical centre for first aid. Later they were shifted to 'hostage reception centre', which was established at the international terminal.

The exercise lasted for nearly an hour. After the completion of exercise, a de-briefing meeting was held.

The whole exercise was meant to check the efficacy of Contingency plan.

Red alert sounded across State

A red alert has been sounded across Andhra Pradesh and security stepped up for Chief Minister K. Rosaiah, Ministers, MPs, MLAs, MLCs and other VIPs in the wake of the ghastly killing of over 70 CRPF personnel in an ambush by naxalites in Dantewada district of Chhattisgarh on Tuesday.

All VIPs have been advised to avoid travel for some time and stay put at their place.

As part of the beefed up security, special attention was being given to those known to have been on the hit list of the extremists. These steps were being taken in a bid to prevent them from facing any kind of risk from the naxalite cadres operating in the State.

The check-posts and vulnerable points on the borders with other States, particularly Chhattisgarh, have been strengthened with deployment of Greyhounds, the anti-naxalite elite force, to prevent infiltration of ultras.

Police deployment was also enhanced at the Secretariat here and around important Government offices in districts, especially those bordering Orissa such as Visakhapatnam, Vizianagaram and Srikakulam. Curbs were imposed on entry into the Secretariat and visitors with passes were allowed after frisking.

There was elaborate security to the Chief Minister during his visit to Mahabubnagar to lay the foundation stone for the Rs. 864-crore World Bank-aided rural drinking water project. Uniformed men occupied every vantage point of the roads and even shops were closed.

Old city back to normality

All localities in the jurisdiction of 25 curfew-clamped police stations remained peaceful on Tuesday prompting the authorities to relax curfew for 12 hours on Wednesday.

The curfew would be relaxed from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. No untoward incident was reported in any part of the curfew imposed areas from Monday midnight till late on Tuesday night.

Mumbai-bound bus passengers robbed; 5 hurt

Four men armed with air guns robbed 40 passengers of a Kolhapur-Mumbai private luxury bus on the Satara-Pune highway, near Kesurde phata, around 1.30 am on Tuesday.

A 52-year-old passenger from Mumbai, who tried to resist the robbery attempt, sustained a pellet injury in his stomach after one of the culprits fired at him with the air gun. Four others, including two drivers of the Borivali-bound bus, also sustained injuries in the incident.

The suspects fled with booty, including jewellery and cash, totally valued at Rs 1.82 lakh.

Hoax call sent Police into a tizzy

An anonymous call, tipping off a senior police officer that bombs were planted at a car showroom on Shahnajaf Road and La Martiniere Girls' College (LMGC) sent the district police into a tizzy on Tuesday afternoon.

Bomb disposal squads (BDSs), anti-sabotage teams (ASTs), dog squads and teams of explosive experts apart from eight battalions were roped in from the 32nd battalion of Provincial Armed Constabulary (PAC) to screen virtually every inch of the sprawling college campus and the showroom.

As the over two-hour exercise continued, top cops watched their moves with bated breaths while hundreds of scared students, parents, teachers and a visibly nervous college management waited with their fingers crossed.

It was not before 4:30pm that the experts gave an "all clear" signal and everyone present on the scene, and those who had left as well, heaved a sigh of relief. But, it took longer to clear the traffic jam near the car showroom at Shah Najaf Road and the college campus that connects to La Plas on Shahnajaf Road side and the swimming pool compound on the Moti Mahal lawns end.

The main cause of the traffic jam around the campus that continued longer than the usual was that the traffic towards the showroom and campus gates was restricted as police tried to get the two premises vacated as a precautionary measure.

Security forces intensify vigil in Srinagar

Apprehending more militant strikes in Srinagar city ahead of the shifting of the civil secretariat from Jammu to Srinagar, the security agencies have increased vigil in the city and intensified frisking on various approach roads to the city.

Passenger and private vehicles are being stopped at various places on the connecting roads and the national highway to Srinagar and passengers and luggage are being thoroughly checked. To keep it a secret, the frisking points are chosen randomly and the Army and police personnel frisk passengers by asking them to come out of their vehicles.

There are inputs that ahead of the shifting of the civil secretariat to Srinagar from Jammu, militants are planning a major terror strike in Srinagar city. So, Police have intensified vigil and are frisking people as part of that.

The Army too had warned that the militants were planning to launch a major attack in the city so as to show their presence and boost the morale of their cadres.

Strike hits health services in Jammu

Another series of strikes at government hospitals, which are already facing staff crunch, has slowed down their functioning dismally, barring emergency services. In the city alone, GMC Hospital has put in place some arrangements to run its services but these are not sufficient. Barring emergency services, the rest of services had been badly affected by the strike.

Maoists Massacre 74 CRPF men, Jharkhand

In their deadliest attack on paramilitary forces yet, Maoist rebels killed 74 members of the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) and two policemen from the Chhattisgarh police, and destroyed an Armoured Personnel Carrier (APC) in the early hours of Tuesday in Dantewada district.

The attack took place in the Mukrana forest, about 540 km southeast of the State capital Raipur. Seven injured personnel were evacuated by helicopter to the Maharani Hospital in Jagdalpur.

Magnitude 7.8 quake hits Indonesia, tsunami watch issued

A major 7.8-magnitude quake hit Indonesia's northern Sumatra early on Wednesday, US seismologists said, triggering a local tsunami watch.

The quake struck at a depth of 46 kilometres, just off northern Sumatra, at 5:15am (0345 IST), according to the US Geological Survey (USGS).

The Pacific Tsunami Warning Center issued a watch for local tsunamis but said a widespread destructive tsunami was not expected.

Indonesia sits on the Pacific "Ring of Fire," where the meeting of continental plates causes high volcanic and seismic activity.

A massive tsunami hit Indonesia and other countries in the Indian Ocean rim in 2004, killing about 220,000 people, most of them in Aceh province in northern Sumatra.

49 dead as blasts rip through Baghdad

At least five bombs ripped through apartment buildings across Baghdad yesterday on Tuesday and another struck a market, killing 49 people and wounding more than 160.

Iraqi officials blamed al-Qaida in Iraq insurgents for the violence — the latest sign the country's fragile security is dissolving in the chaos of the unresolved election.

It was the fourth set of attacks with multiple casualties across Iraq in five days, a spate of violence that has claimed more than 100 lives. Attacks have spiked as political leaders scramble to secure enough support to form a government after the March 7 elections failed to produce a clear winner.
