Maoist bandh in 6 States from today

The Communist Party of India (Maoist) has declared a two-day bandh, starting July 7, followed by an additional five days of protests, demonstrations and public rallies in Chhattisgarh, Maharashtra, Orissa, Bihar, Jharkhand and West Bengal.

Ravula Srinivas, alias Ramana, secretary of the South Bastar Regional Committee of the CPI(Maoist) promised not to target medical stores and essential services, he said the party would specifically target goods trains in the Bastar region.

The Centre has issued an alert in the Naxal-affected States ahead of the bandh called by Maoists. The Home Ministry has asked the States to be on maximum vigil and take steps to foil any attempt at violence, including hostage-like situations.

4-member gang on bikes attacks Tasmac staff, robs Rs 63K from shop

A Tasmac shop supervisor and another customer was assaulted near a Tasmac retail outlet in CIT Nagar, Saidapet. The miscreants also took away money from the outlet.

Four men, all wearing helmets, came on two bikes and hacked a customer who was having drinks outside the Tasmac outlet.

The police said a customer, Prabhu, lost his thumb in the attack. When Velu, supervisor of the Tasmac retail outlet (shop no. 973), came out to inquire about the matter, the assailants assaulted him also and took away Rs 63,000 from the shop.

On a single night, gang targets bank, petrol pump, eight shops

A gang of dacoits looted a petrol pump, and seven shops in Pavnanagar, near Lonavla, on early Monday. Earlier during the night, they broke into a beer shop in Malavli, and also tried to break into a bank in Karla before fleeing.

The Pune rural police and the residents in Karla gave a chase, but the suspects managed to escape. However, they left behind their vehicle, containing several sharp weapons. The police, who seized the vehicle, said the suspects may have stolen it from Satara.

Investigations have revealed that the same gang had committed dacoities in the jurisdiction of Loni Kalbhor, Shikrapur and Loni Kand police stations in the last week.

The gang also tried to break into the Bank of Maharashtra branch in Morwadi in Pimpri and the UCO bank ATM in Kharalwadi on early Saturday.

Flood fears in Punjab, Haryana as rain pours

With unrelenting rains over the past 36 hours, the three northern states of Punjab, Haryana and Himachal Pradesh have got all but cut off from the rest of the country, with most major roads and rail tracks flooded and unusable.

Buses, trains and other vehicles were stranded and the situation is fast turning grim for those along riverine areas in the three states. While small rivulets like Tangri near Ambala and Markanada were flowing way above the danger mark, the bigger rivers, the Sutlej in Himachal and Beas along Kulu Manali, too, have turned menacing. The Army was called to help evacuate people in Kurukshetra and Shahbad. Ghaggar and Rughn in Punjab as well as Haryana are also threatening to break their banks.

Army out in Srinagar as turmoil worsens

After months of calm that had raised hopes of normalcy, Kashmir appears to be getting swept into a spiral of violence again, forcing the authorities to call out the Army across the entire Srinagar city.

The Army will now take over the entire patrolling responsibility in the city from the CRPF and police. The decision was taken after three more protesters, including a 25-year-old woman, were killed in CRPF firing on Tuesday, bringing the death toll in such incidents to 14 since June 11.

Authorities reimposed curfew in most parts of the Valley, which has been simmering since tempers flared after the killing of a 17-year-old in police action last month.

The latest protests broke out after residents of Srinagar's Batmaloo area alleged that a teenager, Fayaz Ahmad, was killed after CRPF fired at a group of people protesting the drowning of another youth, Muzaffar Ahmad Bhat. The body of the 17-year-old was recovered from a rivulet on Monday night and residents alleged that security forces had thrashed him and thrown him in. CRPF denied firing at the mourners and maintained that Bhat had accidentally fallen into the rivulet.

Pakistan bans 23 militant outfits

In the wake of twin-suicide blasts on the shrine of Data Ganj Baksh in Lahore, Pakistan has banned 23 militant organizations, except Jammāt ud Dawa (JuD), which were operating under new names after having been outlawed by the previous military regime and put the name of JuD chief Hafiz Saeed on the Exit Control List (ECL).

The Punjab government has directed police to keep a strict vigil on 1,690 office-bearers and workers of the banned outfits. Sipah-i-Sahaba, Jaish-i-Muhammad, Laskar-e-Taiba, Tehrik-i-Jafria, Harkatul Jihad Islami, Harkatul Mujahideen, Hizbul Tahrir, Lashkar-i-Jhangvi and Sipah-i-Muhammad had been banned by the Musharraf government in 2002, but most of them started their activities with new names.
