### **Noida trader locked in toilet, robbed of lakhs**

The telephone rings in the house of a Noida businessman at 9.30 pm. “How are you sir, I hope all is fine. Are you home,” says an unfamiliar voice on the other end from an unknown telephone number.

After a few minutes, four men intrude into the house, beat up the householder, tie him up and lock him in the toilet. After a while, the intruders decamp with valuables worth several lakhs of rupees.

The loot took place in the house of businessman Rajesh Gupta in T-3, Sector-12 Noida. Police is investigating keeping in view Gupta’s dispute with his wife.

The bandits took a bag containing Rs 1.60 lakh. Then they broke open an almirah lock and took another Rs 45,000, six gold bangles, a chain and rings. While leaving, the thieves snatched Gupta’s mobile phone also.

### **Sports centre owner cheated by ‘bank agent’**

A man running a sports centre in Greater Noida has been cheated of Rs 30,500 by someone who posed as an agent of the HDFC bank. The victim has given a written complaint to the Kasna police station.

Dharminder Singh, who runs a sports centre at Gama Sector-1 in Greater Noida, was being approached on phone by Krishanlal for opening a bank account. Krishanlal had been posing as an agent of the HDFC bank.

On June 3, Krishanlal met Dharminder in the sports centre when the latter agreed to open an account. The caller showed Dharminder his identity card also. He collected the necessary documents and a cancelled cheque for Rs 3.

It is alleged that by erasing the writing on the cancelled cheque by chemicals, the cheat withdrew Rs 30,500 from Dharminder’s account on Friday. He is also accused of withdrawing Rs 4,800 from the account of Dharminder’s friend Yash Pratap Singh sometime back.

## **24 buildings identified as most dangerous in Mumbai municipal corporation survey**

Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai (MCGM) has identified 24 buildings in the city as most vulnerable in the pre-monsoon survey.

The civic body has handed over the list of these buildings to fire brigade department asking it to recheck the areas where they are situated and get a know-how about building plan in case they need to carry out rescue operations in future.

The closed buildings have been issued notices and asked to shift to alternate location. Municipal commissioner had last week said that MCGM has identified overall 721 buildings in dilapidated condition. They will be served notices to vacate the premises in the next couple of days and if needed they will be forcibly evacuated.

The civic body has also identified 127 spots prone to landslides during monsoon. Last year, a landslide in Saki Naka had killed 10 and injured 25 others.

#### **PCPA strikes terror in Jhargram**

Exactly 10 days after the heinous Jnaneswari Express sabotage, the Maoist-backed PCPA militia unleashed terror again on Saturday night, this time in Jhagram town of West Midnapore. They kidnapped 40-odd people who refused to join their rally, dragged them 10 km, before letting them go with a grim warning.

The assault has left the townspeople shocked and scared. Around 500 PCPA members, led by armed militia, gathered in the Dahijhuri side of the town, and stormed the Bhalukkhulia and Balaramdihi localities of Ward 1 a half-hour after midnight. Rebel leaders asked residents to join the rally. Some did out of fear. Some fled.

## Chennai sees 11 robberies in one

As many as 11 robberies and thefts were reported in the city on Saturday, with the total loot amounting to 37.5 sovereigns of gold jewellery, 25 kg of silver, Rs 5.93 lakh in cash and Rs 48,000 worth other valuables.

The most daring of the robberies happened in Kolathur, where burglars drilled a hole into the wall of a jewellery shop -- Rishi Jewellery on Redhills Road -- and escaped with 25 kg of silver jewellery, one sovereign gold, apart from some cash. The incident came to light on Sunday morning when an employee arrived to clean the shop. The front door was intact, but when he saw the empty jewellery display cases, he panicked and informed the owner Amit Surana.

## German robbed

A visa officer attached to the German Consulate in Chennai was robbed of her handbag at Abhiramapuram on Friday.

Police said Christine (62), a German national, was walking to the hotel when a man snatched the handbag containing Rs.6,000 and cosmetics and fled.

### **Fever, flu on the rise**

A spurt in seasonal viral fever and vector-borne infectious diseases has been reported from many parts of the State in the wake of the rain. Also, as public health experts have been warning, the lowering of temperature following the pre-monsoon and monsoon showers has led to a flare-up of Influenza A(H1N1) infection, with 60 cases being reported from various parts of the State in the past month.

Health officials said the increase in viral-fever cases during the rainy season was a seasonal phenomenon. However, the number of dengue-fever cases is going up at an alarming rate in Kottayam and Idukki, while Thiruvananthapuram district, which has always accounted for a chunk of the dengue-fever cases reported across the State, has been faring slightly better.

## **Blockade keeps prices high in Manipur**

The blockade of two national highways in Manipur by Naga groups entered the 55th day on Sunday and the prices of essential commodities remained high. Hundreds of trucks are still stranded.

The All-Naga Students' Association launched the blockade on April 12 to protest against elections to six autonomous district councils in the hills which, it alleged, were given not enough powers to carry out development works. However, the Manipur government has denied the charge.

The blockade, which was intensified after Manipur refused entry to NSCN (I-M) general secretary Thuingaleng Muivah on May 3, has throttled the regular supply of essential commodities, pushing the prices up.

#### **Seven confirmed dead in US Midwest tornado:**

Seven people were killed when a devastating tornado tore through northwestern Ohio, a state emergency management official told AFP on Sunday.

"All seven deaths were a result of the tornado," said Tamara McBride, spokeswoman for the Ohio Emergency Management Agency, adding that the fatalities were from a tornado that touched down in Wood County, southeast of Toledo, Ohio.

As many as seven tornadoes touched down in northwestern Ohio late Saturday and early Sunday morning, according to data from the US National Weather Service.
