50-yr-old housewife shot for resisting chain-snatching

A 50-year-old housewife, resident of Alpha II in Greater Noida, tried to fight off bike-borne chain snatchers on Tuesday night, and was shot by them when she resisted.

On Wednesday morning, about 200 Greater Noida residents blocked the Greater Noida-Noida Expressway, at Pari Chowk in Greater Noida, for about two hours, in protest against what they called sky-rocketing crime in Greater Noida.

The victim Asha Pande had gone to the temple near their society at about 8.45pm on Tuesday. Her daughter, Anjul, was also with her. When the two were walking back to Parsvnath society, two men came on a motorcycle and tried to snatch her gold chain. When Rekha resisted, the pillion rider got off the bike to pull off her chain and in the scuffle that ensued, both hit the ground.

Finally, the man who was still on the motorcycle, shot Rekha in her back. The accused then fled without taking the chain. Hearing the gunshot a crowd gathered and Rekha was taken to Navin Hospital.

Jeweller robbed of Rs 66-lakh items

Yet another jeweller was robbed by four bike-borne men last evening. The robbers fled with jewellery and diamond worth Rs 66 lakh. The incident took place in Geeta Colony. The robbery comes just a day after a jeweller was robbed of about Rs 30-lakh gold in Laxmi Nagar around 12 pm.

Gupta's bike accidentally hit a bike at the Geeta Colony flyover. When he stopped to say sorry, the bikers started demanding compensation. Even as he was busy arguing with them, other bike-borne men decamped with his bag containing the jewellery

Anti-naxal operations in Lalgarh to continue

The Centre is likely to continue with the joint forces deployed in the Maoist-dominated Lalgarh area in West Bengal, not bowing to the demand made by the Trinamool Congress, a constituent of the United Progressive Alliance government.

Trinamool Congress has been demanding that the joint forces be withdrawn as the ruling Left Front cadres and joint forces were “committing atrocities” in the name of tackling Maoists. However, the Centre considered it more of a “political statement” ahead of the Assembly polls in West Bengal.

Traffic diversions in city

Ransom paid, abducted kid back home

Kidnappers of Arnav Bansal, a one-and-a-half year-old boy, released him on Wednesday afternoon reportedly after taking ransom of Rs 20 lakh from his family. He was abducted from his house in Sector 7 a day earlier.

However, Panchkula police and Arnav's family members kept denying that money had been paid to secure his return.

Kidnappers had originally demanded Rs 1 crore as ransom.

They finally settled for Rs 20 lakh, said sources in the police, who added the ransom was given in Derabassi and Arnav released in Sector 25, Panchkula.

Cops fail to crack abduction cases:

Still without any clue in three kidnapping incidents that occurred in the town during the past two years, cracking such cases appears to have become the Achilles' heel of the local police.

The police has so far failed to solve last year's cases in which a two-year-old child, Jiya, and a local realtor, Deepak Rai Sagar, were kidnapped. Even though the families of the one-and-a-half-year old boy, Arnav, who was abducted from the courtyard of his house in Sector 7 yesterday evening, as well as those of Jiya were able to get their wards released after reportedly paying huge ransoms there has been no headway yet in the abduction of Sagar.

With a population of about six lakh, having two national highways and bordering two states and a union territory, Panchkula district has emerged as a soft target for kidnappers.

Bandh hits life in Valley

While no curfew restrictions were imposed in any part of the Kashmir valley yesterday, life was adversely affected due to the bandh called by the hardline faction of the Hurriyat Conference.

All shops and business establishments remained closed across the Valley. The Hurriyat Conference faction led by Syed Ali Geelani has been spearheading the agitation with the issuance of protest calendars against the alleged atrocities by the security forces. It had earlier issued a 10-day calendar from September 27 till yesterday.

It has already come out with a fresh protest calendar, which will be implemented from today till October 16.

The Hurriyat had exempted transport services from the bandh in view of the annual Urs of Sheikh Noor-ud-Din that was observed yesterday as the government had ordered a holiday on the occasion.

However, some private schools were open.

The police here said while the curfew restrictions across the Valley were lifted, these continued in the Palhalan area of Baramulla.

In the morning, some miscreants resorted to stone throwing at Kara lane in Batamaloo. However, they were chased away by the police.
