Man shot dead by 'robbers'

Fleeing robbers opened fire and killed a 40-year-old man and injured another at Palam village in South-West Delhi in the early hours of Sunday.

At least three burglars were entering a house on Gali No.1 of Indira Park after breaking the lock around 3 a.m. when an old woman living in the neighbourhood woke up. She saw the burglars and alerted her neighbour, 28-year-old Rishi Chauhan.

He woke up the other neighbours, including Harish. They raised an alarm and challenged the burglars.

The burglars tried to escape on foot, but were chased by the area residents. Rishi and Harish managed to intercept two of them on Gali No.5. In the ensuing scuffle, one of the burglars opened fire. Harish sustained a bullet injury in his chest and collapsed on the road.

Rishi, however, escaped with splinter injuries in the stomach. In the melee, the burglars fled from the spot under the cover of darkness

"The eldest son of the businessman did not get along with his father and there was a property dispute. It is suspected that he tried to land his father in trouble.

The trickster met the patient, Vanisri, 22, and her mother Vinoda in the recovery ward on the pretext of administering an injection. He gave a prescription to Vinoda and asked her to bring medicines from a nearby medical shop immediately. When Vinoda left the ward, the trickster asked Vanisri to remove the gold chain for giving an injection to her.

Then he took the chain from her and came out from the ward saying that he would get some more medicines and disappeared from the hospital.

Mall CCTV helps cops nab three for techie's murder

The Bharati Vidyapeeth police arrested three youths on Saturday for the murder of a city software engineer working with Symantec, whose mutilated body was found in the Katraj ghat on January 23. Interestingly, the use of the engineer's debit card by the suspects at a mall which was equipped with closed-circuit televisions (CCTVs) led to their arrest.

Two of the three suspects were part of the housekeeping staff at the IT company on Baner road where the 27-year-old engineer, Sarvanand Ramchandran, worked.

Train movement paralyzed as Maoists blow up tracks

Banned Naxal outfit CPI(Maoist) blew up railway tracks between Narganjo and Jhajha railway stations on the Jasidih-Jhajha section under the Asansol division of the Eastern Railway (ER) at 00.30 hours on Saturday night.

The blast damaged railway tracks up to a stretch of about four metres on the down line and two metres on the up line. As a result, normal train movement remained completely paralyzed for about 10-12 hours on Sunday. No casualty was reported.

Normal movement of trains was restored at 10 am on the up line and 12 pm on the down line on the Howrah-Patna mainline section.

The incident took place on Saturday midnight when a large number of Maoists gathered at the Rajla Halt and blew up the railway tracks. The railways stopped normal movement of trains on both the up and down lines for safety reasons.

The Maoists had threatened to blow up vital installation of the railways during the three-day bandh call given by them in Bihar, Jharkhand, Orissa and West Bengal. The Maoists had attacked the Banshipur station under the Danapur division of the ECR and targeted the Narganjo station and its railway cabin several times in the past

Maoist bandh evokes little response in Orissa

The 72-hour bandh called by Maoists commencing today in protest against proposed 'Operation Green Hunt' evoked little response in Orissa.

There was no impact of the bandh in any of the Naxal-hit districts, including Malkangiri, Koraput, Rayagada, Gajapati and Ganjam, police said.

Though operation of government buses was suspended in the district, private buses plied in long and short distance routes in these places as usual.

Sans stray incidents in Motu and Kalimela areas in Malkangiri district, where the red rebels blocked the roads by felling trees in protest against arrest of two Maoists yesterday, the first day of the shutdown went off peacefully, they said.

Meanwhile, security personnel are keeping a strict vigil over the situation and manning strategic places.

Tense Karachi buries blast victims

Pakistan's commercial capital Karachi was tense on Saturday, a day after two bombs killed 33 people, raising further questions about the effectiveness of security crackdowns on al-Qaida-linked militants.

Most shops in the sprawling city of 18 million people were closed and public transport was off the roads as several thousand mourners attended funerals of some of the victims of the two bombs, which wounded 170 people.

The first attack on Friday targeted Shias travelling in a bus to a religious procession, followed hours later by a blast at a hospital where the wounded were being treated.

Big offensive builds up in Afghanistan, thousands flee

A new and possibly decisive chapter of the Afghan war is unfolding. The US is preparing a major attack on the Taliban, the militants are being squeezed in their Pakistani sanctuaries, and the Afghan government is trying to draw them into peace talks.

Taliban militants are also massing and preparing for the big fight, villagers fleeing the area said on Sunday.

Around 2,000 people have fled their homes in a troubled southern district of Afghanistan ahead of the offensive intended to clear Taliban militants. Thousands of Nato and Afghan troops led by newly-deployed US marines are expected to carry out the operation in the Marjah area of Helmand province, described by military officials as the last bastion of Taliban control
