The anonymous kidnapper and rapist, who had struck terror in the hearts of all parents in the Kurla area in the past few months, seems to be back after a two-month hiatus. A nine-year-old girl went missing from Nehru Nagar on Sunday.

The victim has been identified as Nusrat Khursheed Alam Shaikh, a resident of the slums near Shramjivi Nagar. On Sunday evening, the child was playing outside her home while her mother Noorjahan was cooking dinner at home. The girl's father, Khursheed Alam, who was the last to see Nusrat before she disappeared.

Now, swine flu spectre over city with rains

The wave of swine flu, which hit the country last year, may return to strike the city, data suggests. There have been three deaths in the last 15 days and four people tested positive last week, of whom two are still in the isolation ward in Kasturba Hospital.

Civic officials maintain there is no reason for Mumbaikars to panic, but fear the virus may become more active in the monsoon. "The dip in temperature is one reason why the swine flu wave hit India last year. With the monsoon coming, there is likely to be much cooler weather and thus more cases than during the summer," said Dr Pradeep Awate, of the state's influenza cell.

Gang using 'cloned' credit cards busted

A gang that escaped from Karnataka police allegedly while trying to use cloned credit cards came down to Hyderabad to try their luck, only to be caught by Banjara Hills police on Monday.

The Scorpio in which the four-member gang, including a woman, was travelling was

intercepted during regular vehicle checking on Sunday, but a credit card embossing machine and over 300 blank credit cards in the vehicle raised suspicions over their credentials. After prolonged interrogation, the suspects admitted to have been cloning credit cards in Tamil Nadu and Karnataka.

Traffic curbs for fish 'prasadam'

Traffic movement would be restricted near Exhibition Grounds in Nampally on Tuesday and Wednesday in connection with the distribution of fish 'prasadam', the police said.

People coming in four-wheelers from Public Garden side would alight at Government Junior College for Girls, Nampally, park the vehicles there and walk inside through Ajanta gate.

Those coming in buses or vans would have to get down at Bamboo 'adda', Malakunta road and walk up to the Exhibition Grounds. Empty vehicles would proceed to Goshamahal grounds for parking. All VIPs with car passes would proceed from Taj Island and Gandhi Bhavan towards Central Warehouse Corporation and park vehicles there.

After taking the 'prasadam', they would exit from the Exhibition Club gate, turn left to join Dar-us-Salam road and proceed towards Ek Minar mosque.

VIP pass holders travelling on two-wheelers would also take the same route. Those coming on two-wheelers would park their vehicles at open space opposite Ajanta Gate light signal, Chandra Vihar premises, Gruhakalpa, Kattalmandi land and New Mysore Café lane. If spaces at these places are filled, all two-wheelers would be directed to Nampally College for Girls.

All government and military vehicles, without car passes, would be parked in Gagan Vihar building. All police vehicles on duty would be parked at DEO office building (four-wheelers) and the setback area (APHB opposite Andhra Bank (two-wheelers). Vehicular traffic coming from M.J. Market and going towards Nampally would be diverted towards Abids, Nampally railway station road that leads to A1 Cafe.

However water tankers of HMWS&SB, vehicles of Fisheries Department bringing fishes to the Exhibition Grounds and those belonging to voluntary organisations carrying food materials with valid passes would be exempted from this restriction.

General traffic coming from Muslim Jung Bridge intending to go to the Nampally side would be diverted at Alaska hotel towards Dar-us-Salam.

Heavy rain spell over next 48 hrs

The regional Met office has issued warning of heavy to very heavy rain at isolated places in the state over the next two days, due to the influence of the cyclonic storm 'Phet'.

Regional Met director S S Singh said 'Phet' is vigorously churning the waters in the north of Arabian Sea. It is likely to hit Gujarat and Pakistan coast in the next 48 hours.

The cyclonic storm is however expected to weaken gradually.

The most likely areas to be affected by heavy rainfall are Barmer, Jaisalmer, Jodhpur, Jalore, Pali, Sirohi, and Bikaner districts. Light to moderate rainfall could occur at places in Jodhpur, Udaipur, Ajmer and Bikaner divisions and at a few places in Jaipur, and Kota.

5 shot dead in Miami restaurant

According to Miami police, a gunman shot and killed four people at a restaurant and wounded three others before killing himself.

Hialeah police Detective Eddie Rodriguez says that the shooting began on Sunday night in a parking lot outside the restaurant, where the man was seen arguing with a woman. "The man shot the woman then walked into the restaurant and started randomly firing at the people inside. Thereafter, he got into a vehicle and drove away. He was found dead of an apparent suicide, a few blocks away.
