Rs 3 lakh stolen from Noida house in 15 mins

Some unidentified men allegedly decamped with valuables over Rs 3 lakh from the house of an official of the ministry of home affairs in sector-36 in just a few minutes.

The victim M.K. Sinha has filed a report at the Kasna police station.

Sinha had left for office as usual on Tuesday, while his wife Sonali was alone at home. Sonali had gone to pick their son from Urs Line Public School which is about 100 metres from their house. After 15 minutes when she returned, she saw the lock on the door of her house broken and household things scattered.

Sinha said the bandits had decamped with Rs 40,000 and jewellery over Rs 2.60 lakh. A number of other valuables and costly items were also missing.

2 inter- state robbers arrested in Delhi

The Delhi police yesterday arrested two persons for being allegedly involved in several cases of robbery and carjacking.

The accused have been identified as Mahabir Singh (27) and Harish (22). They were arrested from Narela.

With their arrest, the police has claimed to have busted a gang of inter-state robbers. The police has recovered two country-made pistols with two cartridges, one revolver, an English pistol with four cartridges and a motor cycle from their possession.

Suspected Maoists kidnap lineman, damage rail tracks

A group of suspected Maoists held a lineman hostage for hours and damaged the railway tracks by removing fish plates and sleeper clips between Churk and Agorikhas railway stations in deep forests in Maoist-affected Sonebhadra district on Wednesday night. However, a major tragedy was averted as number of important trains, including the Singrauli-Bareilly Triveni Express (4369 Up) and Muri-Jammu Tavi Express (8101 Up), that were to pass on the tracks, were stopped at the Agorikhas station after a timely alert raised by the lineman who was later released by the Maoists.

According to reports, lineman Kharpattu was held hostage by a 40-50 strong group of Maoists when he was checking the tracks around 6.30 pm near Ghaghar river. The ultras forcibly took him with them to the dense forests. They later returned with Kharpattu to the railway tracks around 10pm and removed the fish plates and sleeper clips in a stretch of about 20 meters. The Maoists then went back to the jungles releasing the lineman, who immediately rushed to the Churk railway station and informed the railway authorities about the incident.

Now, fly daily to UK, Canada from Amritsar: From Oct 31, Air India to operate separate flights, with a halt at IGIA

Beginning October 31, the national carrier will launch two separate daily flights to London and Toronto from Amritsar with a stopover in Delhi to augment international connectivity of the Holy City.

Amritsar-Delhi-London flight will take off at 0450 hours and reach London at 1130 local time while the Amritsar-Delhi-Toronto flight will take off at 2210 hours and reach Toronto at 0745 local time. Passengers will change over to Boeing 777 at the IGIA during the stopover of one and a half hours. Besides, there will also be two daily flights to the National Capital and back.

Rail traffic to be affected on Sunday

As many as 16 trains will be diverted via Alappuzha and 16 passenger trains cancelled in view of a 12-hour 'line block' in the Kottayam-Ernakulam section from 6.15 a.m. on October 10.

At least 10 killed in twin blasts in Karachi

Two suicide bombers on Thursday struck venerated Sufi shrine of Abdullah Shah Ghazi in this Pakistani port city, killing at least 10 people and wounding 60 others in the latest in a slew of attacks on sacred places.

The blasts occurred on Thursday evening in quick succession at the entrance of the packed shrine of Abdullah Shah Ghazi, considered to be patron saint of Karachi and is revered by millions of people.

No group claimed responsibility for the blasts though the Taliban are opposed to shrines dedicated to Sufi saints.

The shrine located in the upmarket area of Clifton in this Pakistan's financial capital was packed with thousands of devotees, who had gathered on Thursday, considered an auspicious day, to offer prayers and distribute langar (food).
