**Gang strikes thrice in 3 hrs in Kharghar**

Kharghar witnessed three robberies within a span of three hours early on Thursday, sending shockwaves through the middle-class residential area.

A 30-year-old film editor, Harshwardhan Nayar, fell victim to the first robbery. And the police realised that two more persons were also targeted by the same gang around the same time when Nayar went to the police station to lodge a complaint.

Just 24 hours prior to this, a jewellery shop in Sector 13 was looted of ornaments worth Rs 43 lakh. Unnerved by the spurt of crimes in the area, residents of Kharghar are demanding more police patrolling at night.

**ATS, security agencies warned about terror strikes**

In a fresh terror input, intelligence agencies have alerted the state anti-terrorism squad (ATS) and various security agencies about the possible penetration of 31 operatives of Bangladesh-based outfits, Harkat-ul-Jihad-e-Islami (HuJI) and Jamaat-e-Islami (JEI), into India for carrying out terror strikes.

The one-page alert, marked "secret", contains specific information about 31 members of HuJI who are ready to infiltrate into India. "The members of HuJI are planning to come to India through the Bangladesh border. They will reach Kolkata in small groups. A person called Yusuf Saloni, a resident of Munshidanga (there is an area in Kolkata that is called Munshibazar), will receive them and make arrangements for their accommodation in different lodges," the alert reads. The security agencies are tracking Saloni who is suspected to be associated with several banned outfits.

The alert from the intelligence agency has come after a month. Mumbai Police has been asked to keep its personnel on high alert but the prime targets of the group are said to be New Delhi and Kolkata. "However, the group may move to other cities as well," the alert states. Various alerts have been issued by intelligence agencies in the last few months but none has contained such specific information.

### **Red war base shifting to city**

Kolkata is going to be the operational headquarters of anti-Maoist operations within a week. Because the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF), which is playing a major role in the combat against the anti-Maoists, has decided to shift its central zone headquarters from Raipur to Kolkata.

CRPF special DG Vijay Raman, who is in charge of the central zone and now based in Raipur, has confirmed the report. According to him, Kolkata is more safe than Raipur and more well-connected to other parts of the country. The decision to shift the base has been taken by the Centre, he added.

Raman confirmed that the Kolkata headquarters will be operational by mid-July and it is likely to be set up at the CRPF's eastern sector office in Salt Lake.

Most of the Maoist-affected states including Chhattishgarh, Maharashtra, Jharkhand, Orissa and West Bengal are under the jurisdiction of the CRPF central zone. That is why Raipur had been chosen as the operational headquarters for the anti-Maoist operations.

#### **Reds blow up rly stn, tracks in J'khand**

The banned CPI(Maoist) blew up railway tracks at Tetulmari between Dhanbad and Gomoh stations under the Dhanbad division of East Central Railway ( ECR ) in the wee hours of Thursday. The blast damaged six metres of the railway track completely paralysing train movement for about nine hours. No casualty has been reported in the incident, though. Normal traffic movement was restored at 9.30 am on the Howrah- Mughalsarai Grand Chord (GC) section of the division.

Dhanbad railway division senior PRO A K Das said a large number of Maoists meticulously engineered the track blast at Tetulmari completely paralysing train movement on both the Down and Up lines. He said the railway police have stepped up safety measures, particularly on tracks, at all vulnerable places in the division .

Maoists had given a 48-hour nationwide bandh call since Tuesday night to protest the killing of one of their leaders in Andhra Pradesh allegedly in a police encounter.

In another incident, the rebels partially blew up a portion of the Hehegra Ghat railway station using dynamite at around 12.15 am on Thursday near Latehar under Dhanbad division. They also held two railway employees, Qayum Ansari and Kirpal Singh, captive for sometime.

The blast created panic among other railway employees who fled for safety. Train movement in the section has completely paralysed following the blast. Normalcy on this route was restored only on Thursday morning. The railways incurred a huge loss of revenue due to damage caused to the station building.

#### **Pvt schools shut tomorrow**

Private schools in the city, owing allegiance to the Bihar Public School & Children Welfare Association, will remain closed on July 10 in view of the bandh called by the RJD-LJP alliance in protest against rise in prices of petro products.

A decision to the effect was taken at a meeting of the association on Thursday. Association president DK Singh and general secretary RS Sharma said the decision has been taken to spare the children the unpleasant experience of venturing out of their homes during such bandhs.

The association has urged political parties to exempt schools from the purview of their bandhs in future in the interest of students.

### **Flood alert sounded in 10 western districts of UP**

A flood alert has been sounded in ten districts of western Uttar Pradesh with swelling of Yamuna while water level in Ganga was also rising at many places.

Deputy secretary of the revenue department Raj Raten said that the flood alert has been issued in Muzaffarnagar, Saharanpur, Baghpat, Meerut, Aligarh, Ghaziabad, Gautam Budh Nagar, Hathras and Mathura districts.

According to Central Water Commission (CWC), Ganga is rising in Ballia, whereas Ramganga is rising in Moradabad and Bareilly. River Yamuna is also rising in Etawah while river Sharda is rising in Paliakalan in Kheri.

Ghagra is also rising in Elgin Bridge (Barabanki) Katarniyaghat in Bahraich and Ayodhya respectively. Rapti was on the rise in Balrampur said CWC.

#### **3 bankers booked on charges of fraud'**

CBI has registered a case against three persons of Delhi including an employee of Canara Bank for fraudulently withdrawing Rs 1.31 crore from the Sector-35 branch of Canara Bank. The accused have been identified as Neeraj Chaudhary of Najafgarh New Delhi, Sanjeev Verma of Madangari Road New Delhi and Mukesh Kumar of Vivek Vihar in Delhi. Mukesh Kumar is a clerk with Canara Bank in Delhi.

Though CBI has failed to recover any money, the agency has identified immovable property belonging to the accused, which would shortly be seized.

#### **Flood Fury: Ambala-Delhi rail traffic hit; Hisar highway closed**

With fresh breaches in the Ghaggar, the Tangri and the SYL canal, the flood situation in Ambala, Kurukshetra and Kaithal districts in Haryana remains grave.

Rail traffic on the Ambala-Delhi section has been badly affected with the railway bridge on the Markanda, near Shahabad, caving in. While some trains have been diverted via Saharanpur, others have been cancelled. The Ambala-Hisar highway has been breached between Naggal and the Jansui head by the waters of the Tangri river. The traffic on the road has been suspended indefinitely.

The Ambala district administration has requested the Air Force to keep its choppers ready for dropping food packets and water bottles in certain marooned villages if the situation worsens. Boats are not able to reach these villages, though the authorities claim there is no water in the residential areas.

#### **Kashmir by and large remains calm**

Life in Srinagar and other parts of the Kashmir Valley continued to remain out of gear as curfew was extended to other towns on Thursday. Even as the Army staged flag marches, protests against killings of civilians continued in some parts, but by and large the situation remained calm, tinged with unease.

Srinagar wore a deserted look for the third day as strict curfew restrictions were in place with CRPF and police manning the streets. Even ambulances and essential services were not allowed and the movement of journalists was banned; consequently, no newspaper hit the stands. On Wednesday, the city reverberated with nocturnal protests with people taking to the streets in some areas and using mosque loudspeakers to chant pro-freedom slogans. Natipora, Batmaloo and Aloochoi Bagh saw sloganeering throughout the night. At this, civil authorities asked the Army to stage a few more flag marches in Srinagar.

### **Boy killed, 24 injured as train derails after blast**

A five-year-old boy was killed and 22 other passengers, the driver and the assistant driver of the Kolkata-bound 2518 Garib Rath were injured when the engine, along with a power car and five passenger coaches, derailed after a blast on the track between Chautara and Gosaigaon Hat station in lower Assam's Kokrajhar district in early hours of Thursday.

The train left the Guwahati station at 9 p.m. on Wednesday and the blast occurred at 2.20 a.m. on Thursday.

Another blast occurred on the track at Batasipur in Sonitpur district but there was no casualty. Security forces recovered a powerful bomb from a railway bridge at Pachnoi in the district.

The National Democratic Front of Boroland (Ranjan Daimary faction) has claimed responsibility for the serial blasts on the track and warned of carrying out more such attacks. It asked the people of northeast not to undertake train journey.

**3 arrested in Norway al-Qaida bomb plot**

Three suspected al-Qaida members were arrested Thursday morning in what Norwegian and U.S. officials said was a terrorist plot linked to similar plans in New York and England.

The three men, whose names were not released, had been under surveillance for more than a year. Officials believe they were planning attacks with portable but powerful bombs like the ones at the heart of last year's thwarted suicide attack in the New York City subway.

US Attorney General Eric Holder has called that one of the most serious terrorist plots since 9/11. On Wednesday, prosecutors revealed the existence of a related plot in Manchester, England. Officials believe the Norway plan was organized by the same top-level al-Qaida officials in charge of planning worldwide attacks.
