### Power breakdown hits Metro, hundreds stuck for hours

The Delhi Metro services were hit yesterday and hundreds of passengers were stuck on a newly introduced train for over two hours due to power failure on the Dwarka-Yamuna bank line.

The incident was reported between the R.K. Ashram Marg and the Rajiv Chowk Metro stations around 3.15 p.m.

The passengers were removed through emergency doors and during that some might have suffered sprains. Police is not sure about the number, but some have been taken to a nearby hospital.

The rescue operations got delayed substantially, as some passengers did not follow the instructions given by the train operator of the affected train. He made repeated announcements to the passengers to remain calm, but some passengers opened the emergency exit doors.

The Central Industrial Security Force (CISF), which provides security cover to the Delhi Metro, had to shut down the Rajiv Chowk Metro station for some time.

### Force One commandos set to guard Mumbai

Nearly a year after 26/11 Mumbai terror attacks, the city gets its first batch of Force One commandos, an elite force formed on the lines of National Security Guards (NSG) for the state security.

"The city would have its own elite force, as the first batch of the Force One has been trained and soon they will become operational," Additional Chief Secretary (Home) Chandra Iyengar said.

Over 1,600 young policemen from the state had expressed their willingness to join the Force and were given rigorous training by Israeli and German trainers. The State Government has allotted land at Goregaon in western suburbs to the Force for training and easy access in emergency situation.

Police personnel have been trained in such a way that they respond to any situation.

## **Fake CID officers held for robbery**

Officers of the Shahu Nagar police station have arrested three imposters for posing as CID officers and robbing cash and valuables from people after kidnapping and threatening them with consequences.

"Anklesh Thakur, 35, Rashid Patel, 45, and Kanisht Singh, 29, were arrested and a Qualis car they had hired from a travel agency at Malad to commit crime has been seized," senior inspector Waman Ghadigaonkar said, adding that Thakur was also involved in some robbery cases in Mumbai and Thane. Their fourth associate, Mukhtar, escaped.

The police officer said the three were arrested when they tried to rob 26-year-old Mubarak Ali Choudhari, a leather bags seller.

Around 10.30 pm on November 2, Choudhari was crossing the T junction at Dharavi to go home. Suddenly, the Qualis pulled over by his side and he was dragged inside the vehicle. One of the four then introduced himself as a CID officer and demanded money from him. They took away Rs3,000 Choudhari was carrying and let him go, saying they would visit his house to take Rs12,000 more.

Around 8.30 pm on November 5, the four visited his home. They parked the Qualis about 300 meters from Choudhari's house. Thakur and Patel went inside the house, while Singh and Mukhtar waited in the vehicle. When Choudhari saw the two, he suspected a foul play and screamed for help. His neighbours rushed to his house and nabbed the two. A police van also visited the spot.

### **Maoists shoot 4 jawans after CM combat vow**

In sheer defiance of the huge police bandobast for chief minister Buddhadeb Bhattacharjee's visit to Jangalmahal, Maoists ambushed security forces on Sunday right in front of the fortified Jamboni camp just 50 km from Midnapore town and 30 minutes after the CM left killing four jawans.

The attack came only hours after Bhattacharjee announced intensification of operations against the guerrillas.

#### **All schools in city, nearby districts to be closed on Monday**

All schools in Chennai and the neighbouring districts of Tiruvallur and Kancheepuram districts will remain closed today on Monday, with the government declaring a holiday due to heavy rains. District collectors have issued the order although the forecast for Monday suggests only a few heavy spells.

The north-east monsoon, lashing most parts of Tamil Nadu, have so far left resulted in widespread damage and loss of 21 lives so far, including four on Sunday. In Chennai, residents of some low-lying areas remained marooned and traffic was disrupted due to flooding of subways.

The intensity of the rain has varied over the region, with some of the southern districts bearing the brunt—Tirunelveli and Nagapattinam saw 20% excess rainfall. Farmers in the delta region and adjoining districts too are worried that any intensification of the current spell of torrential rains may severely damage their crops. Yet 13 districts are still experiencing deficient rainfall, with the deficit ranging above 50% of the normal seasonal quantum.

Later, it came to light that some vandals had broken into church and broken five tabernacles, and stolen cash and other valuables from the prayer room on the first floor of the church. The vandals had also ransacked a cupboard on the ground floor, throwing the things inside to the ground.

### **Heavy rain lashes state; high alert in 4 districts**

Barely recovering from the onslaught of the recent floods, the state is threatened by another fury of the nature with the coastal regions and Rayalaseema getting lashed by heavy rains during the last 24 hours and the met office warning of further heavy rains in the next two to three days.

The districts of Nellore, Prakasam, Chittoor and Kadapa have been put on a high alert with Nellore being the worst hit. With all the 46 mandals of the district recording heavy rains, breaches have occurred on the Kota-Sullurpeta and Dagadarthi-Butchireddypalem roads while a causeway was washed away in Jaladanki mandal.

#### **Chilli gang robs Hapur trader of Rs 35 lakh**

A trader from Hapur was robbed of Rs 3.5 lakh in cash by miscreants riding a motorcycle in the congested Naka area on Sunday evening. The victim was on his way to the Charbagh railway station on a rickshaw when the miscreants threw chilli powder on his face and decamped with his bag containing the cash.

The victim, Pradeep Kumar Sharma of Hapur in Ghaziabad district, who deals in wholesale supply of stainless steel, copper and bronze utensils had come to Lucknow on Sunday morning to collect payment from his customers - the shopkeepers in Lucknow who sell utensils on retail. After collecting a total of Rs 3.5 lakh, Pradeep called it a day and started for Charbagh railway station to take a train back home.

It was a crowded place and unaware that someone can target him even here, he was heading towards Charbagh when two youths riding a motorcycle intercepted the rickshaw on which he was, Even before he could understand what was happening, the youth riding the pillion got off the motorcycle and said something pointing towards me. Unable to hear what he was saying, he leaned a bit forward when he threw chilly powder on his face. He tried to resist him and managed to push him away. The next moment he remembered about his briefcase and the cash in it, but by then it had disappeared along with the youths.

**Earthquake in central Indonesia, 2 killed**

A strong undersea earthquake killed two people and damaged buildings on the remote island of Sumbawa in central Indonesia.

At least 20 people were hospitalized on the island after the 6.7-magnitude temblor, many of them with broken bones, said Rustam Pakaya, the head of the Health Ministry's crisis center. He said at least 40 people were injured.

**12 killed in Peshawar suicide attack**

At least a dozen people, including an anti-Taliban mayor were killed and 36 others injured when a suicide bomber struck a busy market on the outskirts of Peshawar in northwest Pakistani on Sunday, nearly two weeks after a massive car bombing in the city left 120 dead.

Abdul Malik, a 'nazim' or mayor who was spearheading efforts against the Taliban, his nephew, a young girl and the head of a 'lashkar' or tribal militia were among the dead.

The bomber struck shortly after 9.30am, when the market was packed with people shopping for sacrificial animals ahead of the Eid-ud-Zuha festival.
